# **Our Journey to Pascha! 2021**

There are twelve major feasts during the year, but there is only one Feast of Feasts: Pascha! The date on which Pascha falls determines the dates for many significant events in the church year, from the pre-Lenten period through Pentecost.

The preparation for Pascha begins several weeks in advance of Great Lent.

Each Sunday leading up to Pascha has its own theme and iconography.

Services are more frequent during this period, and many are not offered any other time during the church year. If you are interested in the Orthodox Church, this is a great opportunity to come and explore. Check our calendar on the home page for the full schedule of services.

The Sundays immediately following Pascha also have distinct themes, leading up to the Feast of Pentecost.

# +Funeral and Memorial Services Updates+

Taking nothing for granted, and with thanks to God, we remain responsibly vigilant in doing what we can to stay as virus-free as possible and to ensure the safety of all our beloved parishioners.

The following rules and guidelines **must** be followed in regards funeral and memorial services.

As of February 23rd and forward, Funeral service will be done in the Church building (ONE DAY SERVICE ONLY) <u>Limited</u> to the immediate family up to 60 peoples.

- •Funeral Service will be live streamed via church Facebook. (optional)
- Those who do plan to attend funeral service in person must adhere to all CDC guidelines by wearing a mask and practicing social distancing.
- •Condolences could be offered through Phone calls, Text messages, or social Media.
- ◆In lieu of flowers, donations may be made in honor of your departed loved ones to Saint George Orthodox Church or your favorite charity as flowers used in the funeral service are discontinued during this pandemic until further notice.

## Memorial Services; 40 Day., 6 mos., or 1 year Guidelines:

- 1. Please call Fr. Kamal to schedule a memorial service for your departed loved one (2 weeks) prior.
- **2.** A memorial service for your departed one is to be done during your family turn (A– J or K-Z). Please follow our weekly schedule charts.
- **3.** Each family is allowed to bring up to **20** attendees. The rest of the extended family, relatives and friends will pray with us **virtually**, **unless** it is their turn to attend church that Sunday.
- 4. Twenty dollars (\$20) for Holy Bread will be given to the church directly. You will receive a loaf of bread in memory of your loved ones at the end of the service.
