HOLY APOSTLES PETER & PAUL - JUNE 29TH

PETER THE APOSTLE. His brother, the apostle Andrew the First-Called, brought Peter to Jesus. His name was Simon, but Jesus called him Peter, which means "rock", from the Greek word petra. He said, "Thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build My Church." Peter was at Jesus' side throughout His ministry. He saw Jesus walk on water and multiply the loaves, and he witnessed the Resurrection. Though he denied Jesus three times, he became a fearless and powerful preacher. His first teaching after Pentecost converted three thousand people. He preached in Palestine, Asia Minor, Italy, Samaria, Caesarea, Joppa, and Lydia. He became the first Bishop of Antioch. He could heal the sick and raise the dead. Even his shadow could heal. Peter, Paul, and Barnabas pulled Jerusalem out of a famine. A nemesis of his was Simon the Magician, a servant of the devil and friend to Emperor Nero. He defeated Simon, but Nero had Peter crucified. He went joyfully to his death and asked that he be crucified upside down since he was unworthy to die as his Master. Nero ended his life by suicide.

Message from the Parish Council

Per the June 21 council meeting, a motion was made to approve the following:

"Wearing a **mask** is highly **RECOMMENDED** inside St. George Church during Divine Liturgy. The Church Hall **will reopen** in the near future".

St. George's COVID-19 Updates – June 2021

Considering recent updates from Metropolitan Joseph and the CDC, we are sharing the following:

Vaccinations

- **1.** Parishioners who **ARE FULLY VACCINATED** are no longer required to wear a mask in Church. **However**, to make it safer for the immunocompromised and children under 12 who could not have the vaccine, **we encourage EVERYONE** to voluntarily wear a mask.
- **2.** As directed by the CDC and Duval County health advisors, parishioners who are **NOT FULLY VACCINATED must continue to wear a ma**sk at all times while on church property. PLEASE continue to practice social distancing (of at least 6 feet) within the church.

Children 5 and up **must c**ontinue to wear a mask at all times while on church property as directed by the CDC and Duval County.

All Teens (*not vaccinated*) **must** continue to wear a mask at all times while on church property as directed by the CDC and Duval County.

Other Guidelines

Capacity in the church has increased to 100%.

Sign-ups are no longer required. Please- You must arrive **no later** than **10:00 am** on Sunday. Doors will be locked at 10:15am.

The following safety protocols will remain.

- A) We have not resumed passing the tray collection baskets yet. However, you may place your 'Pledge Dues' or donation to St. George Church, on your way in or out, in the basket that is located at the Church entrance.
- B) To venerate Icons, Gospel book, or the Cross, simply bow in reverence, but do not actually touch the item with lips or hands.
- C) For receiving the "Antidoron" (blessed bread) at the dismissal, please cup your hands together, and an altar boy will drop a piece of the blessed bread in them. Please do not put your hands into the bread basket.
- D) Holy Communion is the "medicine of immortality," given "for the remission of sins, for healing of soul and body and for life everlasting." Please approach the Chalice with mouth wide open and head tilted back. This will allow the priest or deacon to insert the spoon, turn it over in your mouth and pull it out without touching your tongue or lips. Please do not wipe your mouth with the red cloth.

"40 DAY "CHURCHING OF BABY GUIDELINES

Churching is performed **after 40** days of the Birth and **not to exceed 60** days.

This ten (10) minutes service should be scheduled ahead of time on the Sunday which **is closest** to their 40th day of life and not to exceed 8 weeks of age.

Church Guidelines:

It is important to remember that a mother who has recently given birth, has to be churched with her baby, before **she can** be present within the church services (**i.e.**, Sunday Divine Liturgy, Wedding, Baptism, or Memorial Services, etc.....)

The churching of the baby will take place between **9:45a.m. - 9:55a.m.**, just before Divine Liturgy begins.

Please call the Church office, at least one week prior, to schedule a time for you and your baby to be churched and make sure to be at church on the day of churching at 9:45 am Sharp and be prepared to take communion.

What does it mean to be churched after giving birth?

On the fortieth day after birth, the mother and child are invited to the church temple for a prayer service to reunite the mother and unite the child to the faith community. This practice is also based on the ancient Jewish rite and experienced by our Lord and Savior; Jesus Christ and His holy mother; Mary (recorded in Luke 2:22-40).

Ages ago it took nearly six weeks for a mother to recover from giving birth. This time was also spent bonding with the newborn child. Mother and child did not travel outside the home until both were strong enough. The first place they went was to the temple/church. Today, a mother can recover much more quickly.
