

"So do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is."

Ephesians 5:17

Years ago, I met a man who actually knew my greatgrandfather, whose name was Gustav Adolph Zaske—or, as this fellow called him, "Gus."

I never knew my great-grandfather Gus. In fact, I had never heard much about him. But this man had known Gus quite well, and was eager to share what he remembered.

There's an old proverb which says something like 'The apples never fall far from the tree.' Being one of the apples from Gus's tree, I'll let you decide if the proverb is true. The man who knew my great-grandfather told me: "Ol' Gus, he was a storyteller. Every time you saw him, he had a new joke for you. He was a taller man, and had a kind of happy, go-lucky walk. He'd tell you a story, and then get a little smirk on his face—so you were never quite sure if he was telling you the truth, or just pulling your leg..."

One story the man told me about Gus really struck me—a story of failure (or, perhaps, just plain foolishness). The tale went like this: Apparently, back in the 1910's and 20's, rumors spread throughout southern Winnesota (where Gus lived) that the soil in northern Winnesota was ideal for growing potatoes. What made this rumor so appealing was that a person could buy farmland in northern Winnesota for a fraction of what it cost in southern Winnesota. IF it were true that the northern land would support a huge annual crop of potatoes, an enterprising young farmer could easily strike it rich! You could harvest your bumper crop of potatoes, pay off the land in a couple of years, and from that point on it would be pure gravy train. If...

Gus seized the moment. He and his brother moved north, bought land, and set out to become the Bill Gates of their generation. It didn't happen according to plan. The rumors about potatoes proved false... the Great Depression hit... and Gus and his brother returned to southern Minnesota—not richer, but certainly wiser!

Clearly, the decision to move north turned out to be foolish. However, I definitely have no right to point fingers at my great-grandfather, for I've made some head-scratching decisions of my own over the years. My guess is that you also may have made a choice or two in your life that, looking back, fall in the "regrettable" column.

I guess my point is simply this: We are blessed to be loved by a God who sticks with us always—even when our brains decide to do something bone-headed. As Paul wrote in Romans 8, "For I am convinced that nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Nothing! Even—and especially—foolishness. Thanks be to God!



# **Vaccines for Preteens:**

## What Parents Should Know

### Why does my child need vaccines now?

Vaccines aren't just for babies. Some of the vaccines that babies get can wear off as kids get older. And as kids grow up, they may come in contact with different diseases than when they were babies. There are vaccines that can

help protect your preteen or teen from these other illnesses.

#### What vaccines does my child need?

<u>Tdap Vaccine</u> – This vaccine helps protect against three serious diseases: tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough). Preteens should get Tdap at age 11 or 12. If your teen didn't get a Tdap shot as a preteen, ask their doctor or nurse about getting the shot now.

#### Meningococcal Vaccine -

Meningococcal Conjugate vaccine protects against some of the bacteria that can cause meningitis (swelling of the lining around the brain and spinal cord) and septicemia (an infection in the blood). Preteens need the first meningococcal shot when they are 11

or 12 years old. They need a second meningococcal shot at age 16.

HPV Vaccine – Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines help protect both girls and boys from HPV infection and cancer caused by HPV. All 11- and 12-year-olds should receive two shots of HPV vaccine 6-12 months apart. Preteens and teens who haven't started or finished the HPV vaccine series should ask the doctor or nurse about getting them now.

<u>Flu Vaccine</u> – The annual flu vaccine is the best way to reduce the chances of getting seasonal flu and spreading it to others. Even healthy preteens and teens can get very sick from the flu and spread it to others. While all preteens and teens should get a flu vaccine, it's especially important for those with chronic health conditions such as asthma, diabetes, and heart disease to get vaccinated. The best time to get the flu vaccine is as soon as it's available in your community, ideally by October. While it's best to be vaccinated before flu begins causing illness in your community, flu vaccination can be beneficial as long as flu viruses are circulating, even in January or later.

### When should my child be vaccinated?

A good time to get these vaccines is during a yearly health checkup. Your preteen or teen can also get these vaccines at a physical exam required for sports, school, or camp. It's a good idea to ask the doctor or nurse every year if there are any vaccines that your child may need.

#### What else should I know about these vaccines?

These vaccines have all been studied very carefully and are safe. They can cause mild side effects, like soreness or redness in the part of the arm where the shot was given. Some preteens and teens might faint after getting a shot. Sitting or lying down when getting a shot and then for about 15 minutes after the shot, can help prevent fainting. Serious side effects are rare. It is very important to tell the doctor or nurse if your child has any serious allergies, including allergies to yeast, latex, or chicken eggs, before they receive any shots.

### How can I get help paying for these vaccines?

The Vaccines for Children (VFC) program provides vaccines for children ages 18 years and younger, who are

uninsured, Medicaid-eligible, American Indian or Alaska Native. You can find out more about the VFC program by going online to <a href="www.cdc.gov">www.cdc.gov</a> and typing VFC in the search box.





### Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting

June 13, 2019 Meeting

Meeting was called to order by President Sandy Engdahl at 5:04pm.

I. Devotion – Pastor Mike

Priority one at Faith is to serve God and priority two is to give people a place to belong. A way to help make people feel like they belong is to work towards consensus in our decision-making process. This can make the process take longer but a balance can be found between efficiency and spending the time to consider available options.

- II. Agenda Review
  - a. Agenda was reviewed, and items added or changed as requested.
  - b. Mike Elvester motioned to approve the agenda; Wayne second. Motion carried.
- III. Secretary's Report Mike Elvester
  - a. Review of Secretary's Report
  - b. Motion made to approve the amended report by Gary; second by Ben. Motion carried.
- IV. Treasurer's Report: Review of May 2019 Financials Gary Morgan
  - a. Review & Approval of Treasurer's Report
    - i. The May General Fund income was \$-4,519 vs. actual expenses. YTD \$-9,834.
    - ii. The May Mortgage Fund income was \$-865 vs. expenses. YTD \$3,059.
    - iii. Actual comparisons YTD with General Funds and Mortgage Funds combined:

1.2018: (\$-6,249)

2.2019: (\$-6,776)

- iv. General fund checking is at \$-3,467
- v. Motion to approve Treasurer's report by Wayne, second by La Vonne. Motion carried.
- b. Monthly utility costs have dropped significantly from March to May. Multiple people have access to control the thermostat program, but manual 2-hour adjustments can be done on the wall units.

#### V. Old Business

- a. Garage Sale on June 7-8
  - i. \$1,465 before expenses
- b. Heaven on Wheels Car Show and Shine June 15
  - i. All preparations are done and hoping the rain holds off.
- c. Facility Review Team
  - i. Met June 4 to go over the rooms and their needs.
  - ii. Things are being moved from room to room to see how they work.
  - iii. For future physical donations to the church, pictures can be submitted to the Council President to bring to the Facility Review Team.
  - iv. Special thanks to those who helped to refurbish the Education Wing over the last few months.

#### VI. New Business

- a. Stewardship Increasing Revenue
  - i. In the ELCA, the normal donation rate is about 2%.
  - ii. How do we inspire individuals to give generously so that the church doesn't need to be concerned about how the church is supported? It is the idea that Christians give because they can, not because they have to.
  - iii. One difficulty that the church faces, is that when attendance is down, the giving is down. Options like Simply Giving help to keep a regular flow of donations.
  - iv. Prior to the Sunday offerings, Pastor Mike will explain how Faith's donations to the Synod are supporting others outside our church.
- b. Up-date to the Call Process.
  - i. MSP sent to the council for review. Revisions due to Pastor Mike by June 16 so it can be sent to prospective candidates. He will compile them and send out an up-dated version.
  - ii. The MSP contains the Call Committee's openness to discuss the shorter than normal call of our previous pastor.
- c. Sanctuary Cross Lighting
  - i. The lighting controller is app based with a small group who have access. The ushers and the sound booth operators should have app access. Access via the sound booth PC is going to be reviewed.
- d. General Operations Contacts
  - i. A list of contacts as well as a list of activities that need to be done for regular maintenance needs to be put together. For example annual inspections of the fire suppression system, sprinkler blow outs, etc.
- e. Council Refreshments
  - i. July 14

#### VII. Ministry Team Reports

- a. Stewardship Team
  - i. There is a donation terminal that will allow credit card donations. The fees are similar to Simply Giving in per transaction and percent of donation. The startup cost is about \$100 (once \$300 in donations have been accumulated). A kiosk display will need to be made. It could be used for other events as well like the Sweetheart Dinner.
- b. Facility Care Team
  - i. Handicap stall in Women's restroom needs repair to the door latch.
  - ii. Siding on the back of the Fellowship Hall where the ice comes down will need some repainting. Cleaning the gutters would also help prevent further damage.
  - iii. Crack filling is still on the schedule to be done before the end of the summer.

- a. Next meeting July 11 at 5PM.
- b. Motion to adjourn meeting by Wayne Bachler. Second by Roy Kollar. So moved at 7:04 PM.
- c. We closed with prayer.
