October 10, 2019 Meeting

Present: Sandy Engdahl, Roy Kollar, Gary Morgan, Wayne Bachler, Mike Elvester, Sue Doering, Ben Pany

Absent: Kaelyn Lombard, La Vonne Lund, and Lynn Wilson

Meeting was called to order by President Sandy Engdahl at 5:07pm.

- I. Devotion Sue Doering Psalm 111
- II. Agenda Review
 - a. Agenda was reviewed, and items added or changed as requested.
 - b. Ben motioned to approve the agenda; Wayne second. Motion carried.
- III. Secretary's Report Mike Elvester
 - Motion to approve September meeting minutes by Sue; Roy second. Motion carried.
- IV. Treasurer's Report: Review of September 2019 Financials Gary
 - a. Review & Approval of Treasurer's Report
 - i. The Sep General Fund income was \$5,873 vs. actual expenses. YTD \$9,780
 - ii. The Sep Mortgage Fund income was \$213 vs. expenses. YTD \$4,743
 - iii. Actual comparisons YTD with General Funds and Mortgage Funds combined:

1.2018: (\$-12,097) 2.2019: (\$-5,037)

- iv. General fund checking is at \$-3,775.
- v. Expenses are down about \$-9,000 less than 2018
- vi. Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report by Mike, second y Wayne. Motion carried.

V. Old Business

- a. Fall Festival Recap
 - i. Weather was a little rainy but some additional activities helped to bring in about the same amount as 2018.
 - ii. A variety of gift cards and gifts were also donated as alternative prizes.
 - iii. Proceeds were used to donate \$130 to the food shelf, \$155 to Faith in Action, and \$500 to the General Fund.
- o. Trail of Treats
 - i. October 26 from 5PM to 7PM
 - ii. Partnering with Becker Robotics
 - 1. Last year they had 27 cars and 850 kids that came through. They had 15 businesses that helped to provide candy.
 - 2. Kettle Corn guy sold popcorn and gave proceeds to the Robotics team
 - iii. Clothing drive will be present
 - iv. Hayride with trip through cemetery
 - v. Prep meeting Monday October 14 at 5:30PM
 - vi. Costume contests.
- c. 2020 Sweetheart Dinner
 - Fall Festival committee members and WELCA were in favor of holding the meal at the church as well as changing up the menu. Sue will continue the conversation with Deb Swanson.

VI. New Business

- a. Flooring Cleaning
 - i. Quote received from Long and Son for portions of the Sanctuary, Narthex, offices, kitchen entry, and Fellowship Hall chairs now with the cleaning of the Education Wing revisited in the spring.
 - ii. Motion by Sue Doering; second by Gary Morgan. Motion carried.
- b. Education Wing Finishing Touches and Pastor Yolanda's Office
 - i. Education Wing refrigerator, microwave, cart and shelves are being purchased for approximately \$1,100.
 - ii. Locations of new donations and different furnishings were discussed.
 - iii. Updating Pastor Yolanda's office to freshen up the space and make it an inviting space is approximately \$1,500.
 - iv. Remaining furnishings for the library are about \$225.
 - v. Finishing touches for Noah's Ark are anticipated at \$750.
 - vi. Motion to fund improvements in the Education Wing and Pastor's office to be pulled from various dedicated funds detailed below and to divert \$100 from Noisy Offering to Grapple account by Sue Doering; Roy Kollar second. Motion carried.
 - 1. Noah's Ark and Library Bernard Nelson Life Memo (interest) \$975
 - 2. Education Wing Open area items and Pastor Yolanda's Office
 - a. Education Wing Fund \$797
 - b. Fall Festival Proceeds \$500
 - c. Noisy Offering Youth \$1,150
 - d. If needed, more from Refreshments fund may be utilized.
 - 3. There were some follow up emails in the days after the council meeting that indicated that the Lenten Dinners fund disbursements were already decided at a prior council meeting but were not fully disbursed. This meant that they were not available for this project. They have since been disbursed.
- c. Pastor Yolanda Starting Needs
 - i. Portico Setup Gary will work with Donna to get this completed.
 - ii. Cell Phone Mike Elvester will reach out to Pastor Yolanda with an offer to have her add a line to her plan with her own device and reimburse up to \$100 per month.

Advice from our Parish Nurse ...

How to Keep Kids & Teens from Smoking and Vaping!

It's a burning question for parents and public health officials alike: How do you keep a new generation from starting to smoke?

We already know some strategies that have worked. Public Health campaigns aimed at young people and consistent reinforcement from parents help keep them from striking up the dangerous habit.

But first, a basic question: Why? Why is it so vital that we continue to discourage America's youth from using tobacco?

Four Facts to know:

- 1. **Kids are still smoking**. Every day in America, more than 3,200 teenagers smoke their first cigarette, and an additional 2,100 youths and young adults become daily cigarette smokers.
- 2. **Smoking is dangerous**. According to the surgeon general, 5.6 million Americans younger than 18 will die early from smoking-related diseases. This does not include the lung related diseases and deaths due to vaping.
- 3. **Most smokers start young**. If young people don't start using tobacco by age 26, they almost certainly will never start.
- 4. It's not just cigarettes. Kids today are exposed to cigars, cigarillos, e-cigarettes (vaping and juuling), hookah, (water pipe) and smokeless tobacco (snuff, chew, and dissolvable tobacco). Several of these forms of tobacco are "flavored", increasing their appeal to young people.

What parents can do.

As a parent, you're a powerful influence-even if your teenagers seem to disagree with everything you say. Here are some of the most effective ways you can steer your kids away from tobacco...

Maintain a dialogue.
Start early - begin talking with your kids about smoking and vaping in kindergarten.



Be honest and open to seeing things from your child's point of view. And don't stop. Keep the conversations going as kids get older.

- Think more than cigarettes. Explain that smokeless tobacco, hookah and e-cigarettes all have dangers, including nicotine addiction.
- Prepare your child for peer pressure.
 Discuss what they might say if a friend offers a cigarette or e-cigarette.
- **Set a good example.** If you smoke or vape, the best thing you can do is quit. At a minimum, don't smoke around your children.
- Establish a smoke-free home. Don't allow family members or friends to smoke in your home or car. Make sure the places your child spends a lot of time are tobacco free.

If your child has started smoking or vaping, try to learn why. This may help you talk with him or her more effectively. Instead of punishment, offer understanding and help to resist the dangerous lure of tobacco use and addiction.


