


Following the cantata,



#### Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting

November 14, 2019 Meeting

Present: Pastor Yolanda, Sandy Engdahl, Roy Kollar, Wayne Bachler, Mike Elvester, Sue Doering, La Vonne Lund, Donna Brown, Tom Keller

Absent: Kaelyn Lombard, Lynn Wilson, Gary Morgan, Ben Pany

Meeting was called to order by President Sandy Engdahl at 5:03pm.

- I. Devotion Pastor Yolanda John 15:9-17
  - a. Nonviolent Communication by Marshal Rosenberg
    - i. Four components Observation, feelings, needs, requests
- II. Agenda Review
  - a. Agenda was reviewed, and items added or changed as requested.
  - b. Sue motioned to approve the agenda; Wayne second. Motion carried.
- III. Secretary's Report Mike Elvester
  - Motion to approve October meeting minutes as amended by Wayne, second by Sue. Motion carried.
- IV. Treasurer's Report: Review of October 2019 Financials Gary
  - a. Review & Approval of Treasurer's Report
    - The Oct General Fund income was \$-2,907 vs. actual expenses. YTD \$-12.687
    - ii. The Oct Mortgage Fund income was \$-1,534 vs. expenses. YTD \$5,628
    - iii. Actual comparisons YTD with General Funds and Mortgage Funds combined:
      - 1. 2018: \$-13,300
      - 2. 2019: \$-7,058
    - iv. General Fund checking is at \$-6,727
    - v. As we continue to run negative in the summer months, Simply Giving is an avenue that can be used to keep the church expenses covered year-round.
    - vi. Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report by Sue Doering, second by Mike Elvester. Motion carried.

#### V. Old Business

- a. Trail of Treats
  - i. The event was a great success. Attendees have already expressed interest in coming again next year.
  - ii. Worked with the Becker Robotics Team this year and may bring in the National Honor Society.
- b. 2020 Sweetheart Dinner
  - i. Currently scheduled for Sunday, February 9, to be hosted at Faith Lutheran Church
  - ii. Will put in a Save-the-Date into the November Newsletter.
  - iii. We are still in need of a coordinator. Sue will reach out to Deb Swanson to see if she is interested again.
  - iv. There has been feedback that the price of the raffle tickets was high. This will be shared with the group that heads up the dinner.
- Nametags for Members
  - A kiosk style stand to clip nametags onto in the Narthex was a recommended design. This allows the stand to be moved out of the Narthex during outside events such as funerals and weddings.
  - Motion to have Mike Doering and Roy Kollar begin design and construction of a nametag stand as well as nametags by Wayne Bachler. Second by Mike Elvester. Motion carried.
- d. Nomination Committee
  - i. Ending Terms: President, Secretary, At-Large (3), and Youth.
  - ii. Existing council members that are absent will be contacted to see if they are interested in continuing in the open positions.
- VI. New Business
  - a. Laptop for Pastor Yolanda and Office Computer Updates
    - . Windows 7 at end of life which means security updates will no longer be made.

#### January 2020 Faith Talk

- ii. A laptop was part of the agreement with Pastor Yolanda in the call process.
- iii. Estimating \$2,000 for a new laptop, office PC for Donna, and rebuilding the remaining PC's.
- iv. Completion estimate by the end of January 2020.
- v. Motion to purchase a laptop and upgrade the office PC's in 2020 by Sandy. Second by Sue. Motion carried.
- b. Church Purchases Credit Card
  - i. Currently purchases for the church are being done by individuals and then the individuals submit a form to get reimbursed.
  - ii. In many cases sales tax is paid by the individuals that wouldn't be taxable based on the nonprofit status of the church.
  - iii. Roy and Donna will work with Sherburne State Bank to see what is needed to set it up.
  - iv. Motion made to pursue a church credit card, card being kept with the office staff by Wayne, second by Roy. Motion carried.
- c. Sunday Refreshments
  - i. Additional volunteers are needed as there are a small group of people that are repeating in a small rotation. One concern is that we have paper sign-up sheets as well as the SignUp Genius that has had people doubled up.
  - ii. Previously family groups were designated 2 months out of the year to volunteer. An issue at that time was getting people signed up during their month.
  - iii. From our Stewardship cards for Ministry Team volunteers, individuals can be identified that could be on a volunteer contact list.
  - iv. The website will also be updated to make it easier to navigate to the SignUp Genius.
  - v. Council will cover November 24.
- d. Ratify Pastor Yolanda's Housing Allowance
  - i. Motion to ratify Pastor Yolanda's housing allowance per her contract by Sue. Second by Wayne. Motion carried.
- e. Job descriptions/performance evaluations/direct report for paid positions
  - i. Personnel Committee consists of Executive Committee (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer).
  - ii. Job descriptions need to be evaluated to see if they are up to date.
    - 1. Identification of what positions are needed for paid positions versus lay people in the congregation.
  - iii. Performance evaluations may be on service anniversaries in the future.
  - iv. Paid positions at the church are to be direct reports to Pastor Yolanda who can provide feedback to the Personnel Committee.
  - v. Action items:
    - 1. Gather job descriptions.
    - 2. Determine anniversary dates.
    - 3. Have the Personnel Committee meet to prepare evaluations.
- f. Facility Use Policy
  - Motion to remove \$25 charge and replace with a recommendation of a donation in the facility use policy by Mike Elvester.
     Second by Wayne Bachler. Motion carried.
  - ii. Some conversations were had regarding the condition the church is to be left in following the group using the church.
  - iii. Facility Use Policy to be further reviewed in January. A recommendation was given to contact other churches in the area to find what their facility use policies are for guidelines. What doors are to be utilized and secured following use are to be included in the policy update.
  - iv. For the current request of a Boy Scout group, Donna will reach out to them and offer the Fellowship Hall for use explaining the expectation that the facility is returned in the condition that it was found.
- g. Security of the Building
  - i. During office hours notifications when front doors are open has been requested. A conversation was had about general security needs in the future possibly with cameras, etc. A higher-level system will be the topic of a future meeting. In the meantime, Roy will look into a door ringer for when the front doors are open.

## Advice from our Parish Nurse ... **What is Glaucoma?**

Glaucoma is a group of eye diseases that can cause vision loss and blindness by damaging a nerve in the back of your eye called the optic nerve. The symptoms can start so slowly that you may not notice them. The only way to find out if you have glaucoma is to get a comprehensive dilated eye exam. There's no cure for glaucoma, but early treatment can often stop the damage and protect your vision.



#### What are the symptoms of glaucoma?

At first, glaucoma doesn't usually have any symptoms. That is why half of the people with glaucoma don't even know they have it. Over time, you may slowly lose vision, usually starting with your side (peripheral) vision-especially the part of your vision closest to your nose. Because it happens so slowly, many people can't tell their vision is changing, especially at first. But as the disease gets worse, you may start to notice that you can't see things off to the side anymore. Without treatment, glaucoma can eventually cause blindness.

#### Am I at risk for glaucoma?

Anyone can get glaucoma, but some people are at higher risk. You're at higher risk if you:

- Are over the age of 60
- Are African American or Hispanic/Latino and over age of 40
- Have a family history of glaucoma

Talk with your doctor about your risk for glaucoma, and ask how often you need to get checked.

#### When to get help right away

Angle-closure glaucoma (most common type in the United States) can cause these symptoms. If you have these symptoms, go to the doctor or an emergency room now.

• Intense eye pain

- Upset stomach (nausea)
- Red eye
- Blurry vision

### How will my eye doctor check for glaucoma?

Eye doctors can check for glaucoma as a part of a comprehensive dilated eye exam. The exam is simple and painless – your doctor will give you some eye drops to dilate (widen) your pupil; and them check your eyes for glaucoma and other eye problems. The exam includes a visual field test to check your peripheral (side) vision.

#### Did you know?

Glaucoma can happen in one eye or both eyes. Some people with high eye pressure don't get glaucoma – and there's a type of glaucoma that happens in people with normal eye pressure. The amount of eye pressure that's normal varies by person – what's normal for one person could be high for another.

#### What's the treatment for glaucoma?

Doctors use a few different types of treatment for glaucoma, including medicines (usually eye drops), laser treatment, and surgery. If you have glaucoma, it's important to start treatment right away. While it won't undo any damage to your vision, treatment can stop it from getting worse.
