

As I type this article, my shoulder is throbbing a bit, and my legs and back ache. Why, you may ask? Let me give you a one-word answer:

Crabapples. Now allow me to explain.

My townhouse was built in 2000, and the builders decided, as part of the landscaping, to plant a crabapple tree in our front yard. Every spring, Nancy and I are treated to a two-week, delightful feast of luscious blossoms and sweet fragrances thanks to the crabapple tree.

Throughout the summer months, the magnificent

shade provided by the tree keeps our kitchen area cool and comfortable.

Overall, it's a beautiful tree, and we're glad to have it. But, as you know, every rose has its thorns. For us, our 'thorns' are the crabapples which grow on the tree. We get overloaded each August with seemingly millions of those little red orbs.

Here's the kicker: If you don't deal with the ripe crabapples before they turn rotten and fall splat on the ground, their proximity to our house leads to wretched odors and swarming clouds of fruit flies. Which, for me personally, also leads to one extremely unhappy wife.

So... every August, I become a crabapple-gathering maniac. I spend hours upon hours on ladders picking those blasted red spheres. After the low-hanging ones have been picked, I take a huge extendable pole and practically throw my shoulder out of joint knocking the ones way up high to the ground by the hundreds at a time, after which I strain my back and upper thighs bending down to collect them into large baskets. I always reach a point, after a few days, where I am totally ready to head to Menard's to buy a chainsaw...

And yet, I don't follow through with that lethal plan for one very important reason: I have a friend named Jeff who takes our crabapples and makes the most delicious cider out of them that I've ever tasted. What to me are aggravating little sour pellets, Jeff turns into beautiful works of (liquid) art!

Thus, the battle with the crabapples is my yearly reminder that, as it is between me and the apples, so it is with our relationship to God. Our God loves to take us—as exasperating as we can be at times—and make something wonderful out of us! We, like the crabapples, are also part of a large tree: our tree is known as 'humanity'. God gathers us much in the same way that I gather the apples, sometimes with great care and sometimes just picking us up off the ground after we've fallen. And instead of seeing us as annoyances, God sees us as things of splendor... things teeming with possibilities... people worth dying for...

I guess when all is said and done, maybe the crabapples aren't so bad after all. Maybe the real 'crabapple' is the one doing the gathering!!

Calling Our New Pastor...

"A dream doesn't become reality through magic; it takes sweat, determination, and hard work."

My friends, we have been dreaming here at Faith Lutheran. We have been dreaming about the next chapter of our church's history and all of the amazing things we can do together as a community of Christians. General Powell is right in saying that it does take sweat, determination, and hard work, but he probably should have added patience in there as well. It has been my privilege to serve on both the Transition Team and the Call Committee as we prepare to call our next Pastor. The process is long, involved, and has many confidential aspects, which all become difficult because it's such an exciting process!

It's always been hardest for me as a member of a congregation to sit quietly and wait to find out who the next Pastor will be because I'm not the type to sit around and wait. I like results, friends. Preferably yesterday. I can't be the only one, or we wouldn't have instant downloads of music, movies, books, fonts, clip art, posters, craft patterns, recipes, lesson plans, computer software, apps, and probably a thousand other things I'm not even thinking about right now. I can literally order something from amazon.com and it will be at my house within two days. When I was a kid, we ordered from the JCPenney Catalog, and it felt like months went by before our things would arrive.

Back to dreaming, though. Over the past ten months, we have taken steps that will lead us to finding a new Pastor; someone who will match our dreams for this place and raise up leaders within our midst. In order to do that, the Church Council developed a Transition Team. Facilitated by Pastor Mike, we were challenged with the task of taking a deep look at ourselves through an online survey tool called the CAT survey. Our congregation's responses on that survey provided the Transition Team and the Call Committee with insightful, important information about how we currently see our church and how we envision our church to be in the future.

Once we had analyzed that information, the Transition Team began working on our Ministry Site Profile (MSP), which, among other things, is a document presented to the Synod to share with prospective pastoral candidates about our church. It includes information about our demographics, our budget, our mission and vision, things we need to work on, things we

work on, things we are proud of, and what we value most as a body of Christ.

The Transition
Team then handed the
MSP over to the Call
Committee, and we
continued that work,
analyzing our trend
data from the CAT
Survey and then

identifying the common ideas teased out through that process. And then we dreamed. We dreamed about the kind of place we all want Faith to be. We dreamed about the type of leader we would want for this place. Then we shared our dreams with the Synod.

Here's where it gets good, friends. The Synod listened. They read our MSP. They found candidates that they felt would be great matches for us and they sent them our way. And they did a stellar job! We have

interviewed all of them, and the Pastors that the Synod sent to us have all been top-notch. Seriously. We sat around looking at each other with our jaws gaping. How have we been so blessed? The Holy Spirit has certainly been working behind the scenes!

The Call Committee has been tasked with an enormous job. As representatives of the congregation of Faith Lutheran Church, we have been asked to find the leader that will walk with us in faith. We have interviewed, deliberated, and prayed. We have been humbled by your trust in us, the support of the Synod, the amazing, visionary, and faithful

Pastors we have interviewed, and the process with which we have been engaged.

The best part, friends, is that our congregation's hopes and dreams have been the backbone of every single decision that has been made, and we feel confident that our next Pastor will share in those dreams with us. We are so very close to completing this process and beginning the next chapter! The future is looking bright

for Faith Lutheran!

The ELCA's tagline is "God's work. Our hands." This congregation, full of amazing, talented, dedicated, kind, welcoming, caring, generous, faithful people, is ready to continue that work alongside our new Pastor. Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting

July 11, 2019 Meeting

Present: Sandy Engdahl, Roy Kollar, La Vonne Lund, Gary Morgan, Wayne Bachler, Pastor Mike Zaske, Mike Elvester, Sue Doering, Ben Pany, Kaelyn Lombard

Absent: Lynn Wilson

Meeting was called to order by Vice President Roy Kollar at 5:04pm.

- I. Devotion Pastor Mike A More Christ Like God
- II. Agenda Review
 - a. Agenda was reviewed, and items added or changed as requested.
 - b. Ben motioned to approve the agenda; Kaelyn second. Motion carried.
- III. Secretary's Report Mike Elvester
 - a. Review of Secretary's Report
 - b. Motion made to approve the amended report by Wayne; second by Sue. Motion carried.
- IV. Treasurer's Report: Review of June 2019 Financials Gary
 - a. Review & Approval of Treasurer's Report
 - i. The June General Fund income was \$-755 vs. actual expenses. YTD \$-10,589
 - ii. The June Mortgage Fund income was \$55 vs. expenses. YTD \$3,112
 - iii. Actual comparisons YTD with General Funds and Mortgage Funds combined:

1.2018: (\$-8,785) 2.2019: (\$-7,477)

- iv. General fund checking is at \$-4,388. As with all monthly reports, this is a snapshot as of the 1st of the month. Donna balances paying bills throughout the month as income flows in.
- v. Motion to approve Treasurer's report by Roy, second by La Vonne. Motion carried.
- b. Proceeds from Heaven on Wheels Car Show
 - i. The net proceeds were \$1,666.74. \$500 will be held for 2020 seed money in the dedicated and the rest will be put into the General Fund. Motion made by Mike Elvester. Ben second. Motion carried.
- V. Old Business
 - a. Continue discussion on Stewardship (from June 13 meeting)
 - i. Square Terminal
 - Pros Inexpensive standalone hardware, 2.7% fee plus \$0.10 per transaction, donation amount is changeable, receipt prints at time of transaction, Apple Pay compatible, no long-term contract.
 - a. One-time fee of \$400, \$300 will be reimbursed if \$300 in donations processed in the first 180 days.

- 2. Cons Looks like a register making a payment instead of donating, not as intuitive for users, inventories card information, requires Wi-Fi, requires individual person's SSN tied to the terminal.
- ii. Dip Jar Terminal
 - 1. Pros Uses cell phone signal instead of Wi-Fi, more inviting user experience, quick donation process.
 - 2. Cons Fixed donation amount per transaction (can be changed but takes about 4 minutes), 6% fee plus \$0.17 plus \$99 annual fee, receipts only via contacting the company, bookkeeping more difficult due to less flexible reporting.
- iii. We also discussed the option of Text to Donate. It is another option offered by Vanco but has additional fees associated with it as well.
- iv. Motion made to purchase a Square Terminal by Gary Morgan. Second by Wayne. Motion carried.
 - 1. Variable donation amount, inexpensive hardware and lower fees were contributing factor for decision.
- b. Heaven on Wheels Car Show
 - i. Total of 46 cars participated. Weather turned out great. Working on plans for 2020. On July 28 the remaining food will be served after church.
 - ii. Council Refreshments on July 14 Ice cream and floats.

VI. New Business

- a. Sabbatical Policy
 - i. Typically this is a time for a pastor to be refreshed. Eligibility is usually around a 3-month sabbatical after 7-10 years of service. Many times pastors will use this time to do a project or in some cases enjoy some time relaxing. Usually paid either full or at least partial pay.
- b. Parental Leave Policy
 - i. The council discussed different options that their individual employers provide. The recommendation was made to create a subcommittee to present the council with a couple proposals that could be made available to prospective pastors. Gary and Pastor Mike will reach out to some congregational members to create the committee.
- c. Goals for Pastor Mike through the end of the year
 - i. The Grapple program has been set up through MEA. Confirmation programming is next.
 - ii. Pastor Mike is ready for some other projects while he is still at Faith and is open for suggestions. They should be items that are not necessarily permanent in case our new pastor has their own ideas.
 - 1. Developing effective outreach
 - 2. Stewardship activities
 - 3. Safe Haven policy review and are we conforming?
 - 4. Youth activity for Confirmation kids between school activities and Confirmation
 - 5. Post Confirmation activities to keep our youth connected with each other

VII. Ministry Team Reports

- a. Facility Care Team
 - i. Handicap stall in Women's restroom needs repair to the door latch.
 - ii. Parking lot quote was \$2625 but will need to requote. Gary priced out materials and equipment and it would cost about the same as having it done by Metro Paving. Will update once new quote is received.
 - iii. Behind the church on the ends of the Sanctuary, there is no eave. Gary and Terry are reviewing how to repair to make sure water is not leaking into the wall.
 - iv. Library carpet is bubbling up. Seems as though the adhesive may be losing its grip.
 - v. Still need some care for the Memorial Garden.
- b. Education Team
 - i. VBS Sign Katie Meyer looking for help with a sign out front.
- c. WELCA
 - i. Served at a funeral. Dingman welcomed and handled items that are not usually done when a cremation is done.
- d. Communications Facebook page continues to be updated.

- b. Motion to adjourn meeting by Sue Doering. Second by Mike Elvester. So moved at 6:48 PM.


We're not Uncle Sam, but we are recruiting! If you love music, have a talent for it, or want to learn more, we would love to have you be a part of our worship music experience!
