The Town Clerk/Manager, Carol Skeard, informed the council that the replacement of the water line on the Main Street has not gone to tender. According to Garret Anderson, Allnorth, the drawings have to be completed and the water line tender will not be put out until the Spring.

The Town Clerk/Manager, Carol Skeard, informed the council that the project for replacing the water/sewer on Serpentine Road and installing a new pump on Serpentine Road has started. According to the sewer line will be done this year and the pump will be worked on. Whereas, the water line will not be installed until the Spring of next year.
