Veterans Day in Shreveport: A Week of Honor and Celebration

Shreveport and the surrounding communities came together this November to honor veterans with a series of moving events, tributes, and the annual Louisiana State Fair Veterans Parade. The celebrations reflected the region's enduring gratitude for military service and sacrifice.



Veterans Day Events Across Shreveport

- The Bricks of Honor Ceremony at American Legion Post 14 was held on November 11, where engraved bricks were placed to memorialize veterans. Families and fellow service members gathered to witness the solemn tribute.
- At LSU Shreveport, keynote speaker Russell Mathers, STRIKEW-ERX director and retired U.S. Air Force officer, addressed the audience with reflections on service and innovation.
- Centenary College's program featured Major General Jason R. Armagost, who spoke at the Hargrove Memorial Amphitheatre, inspiring students and community members alike.
- The Shreve Memorial Library's Freedom Tree lighting ceremony brought together residents for a symbolic act of remembrance, illuminating the tree in honor of veterans. These events provided opportunities for the community to express gratitude and to reflect on the sacrifices made by service members.

Veterans Celebration Committee & Honorees

Commissioner Ken Epperson, along with the Veterans Celebration Committee, community leaders, and veterans, gathered to proclaim November 3–11, 2025 as Veterans Celebration Week in Caddo Parish. This annual observance honored the service, sacrifice, and dedication of the men and women of the Armed Forces. Residents, businesses, and organizations were encouraged to participate in Operation Green Light and join in recognizing veterans across the parish. The Committee's 15th Annual Veterans Celebration Ceremony was held on Saturday, November 15, 2025 at 5 p.m. The event was described as a blessing, bringing together brave men and women whose service continues to inspire. Commissioner Epperson was praised for his leadership in facilitating this historical event. AMERICA FIELD TRIP CONTEST

America250 launches expanded ‘America’s Field Trip’ student contest

For the 2025-2026 school year, 250 awardees will be selected – nearly double the 150 from last year. Now in its third year, “America’s Field Trip” is expanding significantly as part of the lead-up to the nation’s 250th birthday in 2026. The contest, according to the America250 website, “invites students in grades 3–12 to answer the question ‘What does America mean to you?’ through original writing or artwork.”

For the 2025-2026 school year, 250 awardees will be selected – nearly double the 150 from last year – giving more students the opportunity to experience free trips to some of the country’s most iconic historic and cultural sites in the summer of 2026. The 125 first-place awardees will enjoy an expanded slate of destinations.



The deadline for entry is March 30, 2026. Students, families and educators can find submission guidelines, contest rules, FAQs and classroom resources at america250.org/fieldtrip. In Loving Memory of a Distinguished Air Force Veteran

Leonard C. Barnes American Legion Post 450 honors the life and legacy of one of our own, a devoted Air Force veteran who faithfully served his country for over 20 years. His career was marked by dedication, discipline, and an unwavering commitment to excellence as an Aerospace Ground Equipment Mechanic and Electronic Computer and Switching Systems Technician in the United States Air Force—REGAF.

Throughout his distinguished service, he earned numerous commendations reflecting his outstanding performance and devotion to duty, including the Commendation Medal with Device, Good Conduct Medal with 5 Devices, National Defense Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with 3 Devices, Overseas Short Tour Ribbon, Overseas Long Tour Ribbon, Longevity Service Award Ribbon with 3 Devices, NCO Professional Military Education Graduate Ribbon with Device, Training Ribbon, and the Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with Device.

His professional achievements were equally impressive. He graduated from the NCO Leadership School (May 1976) and NCO Academy (May 1983), and completed Advanced Technical And Leadership Training, including Worldwide Network Systems Evaluation (272 hours, February 1988), Communication Networks Evaluation (272 hours, December 1986), LATS System Maintenance (40 hours, November 1982), Digital Communications Processor Group (72 hours, August 1981), Teletype Maintenance Training (July 1981), Data Analysis Systems Maintenance Technician (August 1980), and High Value Soldering and Microelectronic Repair Techniques (September 1980).

After more than two decades of honorable and faithful service, he retired as a Master Sergeant (E-7)—a testament to his leadership, skill, and integrity. His lifelong dedication to his country continued beyond his military years through his active participation in Post 450, where he remained a steadfast supporter of veterans and community service.

We at Leonard C. Barnes Post 450 extend our deepest condolences to his family and loved ones. His legacy of honor, courage, and service will forever live on in the hearts of his fellow Legionnaires and all who had the privilege of knowing him.

Rest in peace, Master Sergeant. Your duty is done, your service complete, and your country stands forever grateful.

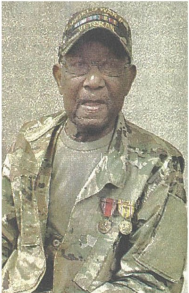

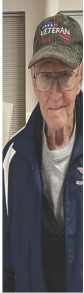

Hygiene Items to Homeless Veterans Program

Leonard C. Barnes Post 450 has donated roughly 1,000 individual hygiene products, including highly needed feminine care items, to support homeless veterans in the Shreveport area. The collection, valued at more than \$500, was delivered directly to the Homeless Veterans Program at Overton Brooks Veterans Administration Medical Center and will be distributed to veterans as needs arise.



Donation Details

The donation package includes a wide range of personal-care essentials, with a special emphasis on feminine hygiene products that are often in short supply for people experiencing homelessness. The items were handed over to staff at the Overton Brooks VA Medical Center Homeless Veterans Program for immediate distribution. Past Post Commander David Williams, Historian Margaret Mims, and Chaplain Richard Thomas delivered the items personally.

Expected Impact

These supplies will help meet day-to-day needs for veterans who are transitioning out of homelessness or who are receiving services through the VA. Access to basic hygiene products improves dignity, health, and the ability to participate in job searches, medical appointments, and other steps toward stability.

Community Significance

Donations like this address gaps in services that are not always covered by existing programs. By focusing on both general hygiene items and feminine products, Leonard C. Barnes Post 450 is helping ensure that all veterans—regardless of gender—have access to essential personal-care supplies.

How Others Can Help

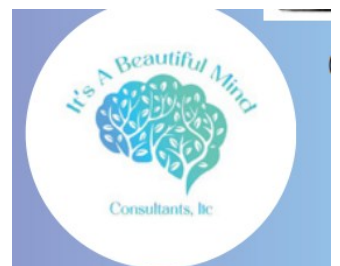

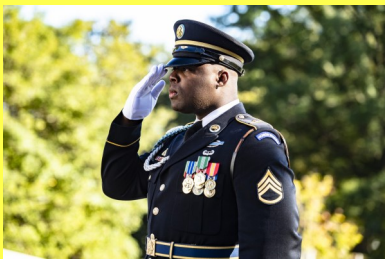
