# **A Call to Authentic Faith**

# A Reflection from 2 Corinthians 13:1–10

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ, As we welcome the month of June, we give thanks to God for His sustaining grace and ever-present help in our journey of faith. This year may be moving quickly, but every new month is a chance to recalibrate our hearts toward heaven and recommit our lives to the cause of Christ.

This month, the Lord has placed on our hearts a powerful and sobering portion of Scripture from 2 Corinthians 13:1–10, where the Apostle Paul delivers his concluding words to the church in Corinth. Though written centuries ago, this message remains incredibly relevant to the Body of Christ today.

Let us walk through this passage together and draw out four vital truths that can transform how we live and serve in the power of Christ.

### 1. A Serious Reminder (vv. 1–2)

"This will be my third visit to you. 'Every matter must be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' I already gave you a warning when I was with you the second time. I now repeat it while absent..."

Paul begins by reminding the Corinthians that his visit is not simply another social check-in. It is a serious spiritual visitation—one filled with concern for the health and holiness of the church. As a loving spiritual father, Paul is prepared to confront sin and protect the flock.

God often sends gentle warnings before judgment. The goal of discipline in the church is not punishment, but restoration. We must not treat His warnings lightly. God desires a people who walk in truth and integrity.

Reflection Question: Are we ignoring or responding to the gentle convictions of the Holy Spirit?



## 2. Examine Yourselves (vv. 5-6)

"Examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith; test yourselves. Do you not realize that Christ Jesus is in you—unless, of course, you fail the test?"

This is one of the most powerful and personal calls in all of Scripture—a command to look inward and evaluate the sincerity of our faith. Paul shifts the focus from outward appearances to the inward reality of Christ dwelling in us.

Illustration: The Counterfeit Note

Years ago, a bank teller in a country was caught passing counterfeit currency. His notes looked real on the outside, but they lacked the special watermark and texture that only a trained eye—and a real test—could detect. Many people had accepted his fake bills, never realizing they were worthless until they reached the bank.

Likewise, outward appearances can deceive even ourselves. Without regular self-examination through the Word and the Holy Spirit, we may be walking with a counterfeit faith—one that looks convincing but lacks Christ's life within.

Challenge: Take time this month to ask the hard questions:

- · Is my faith active or passive?
- Am I walking with Christ or merely talking about Him?
- Is there fruit in my life that proves Jesus lives in me?

# 3. Christ's Power in Our Weakness (vv. 3–4)

"He was crucified in weakness, yet He lives by God's power. Likewise, we are weak in Him, yet by God's power we will live with Him in our dealing with you."

The Corinthians questioned Paul's authority because he didn't come with outward grandeur. But Paul responds with a deeper truth: real power comes through surrendered weakness. Jesus

was crucified in weakness—but now He lives forever in resurrection power.

Likewise, when we embrace our weakness and depend on God, His power is made perfect in us. Ministry is not about human strength or charisma—it's about yielding to Christ's strength in our limitations.

#### Story: The Little Preacher Boy

In a remote village, a 12-year-old boy named Reuben felt a burning desire to preach. He wasn't educated, didn't come from a ministry family, and stuttered when he spoke. One Sunday, the local pastor gave him a chance to share a five-minute word.

Reuben stood trembling, barely able to form sentences. But as he opened his Bible and began to read a verse about God's love, a visible presence fell on the congregation. People began to weep. Hearts were touched. That stuttering, weak boy became a powerful

vessel—not because of his strength, but because Christ's power rested on his humility and sincerity.

Encouragement: If you feel weak, weary, or insignificant—take heart. You are exactly the kind of vessel through whom God reveals His strength.

# 4. Building Up, Not Tearing Down (vv. 8–10)

"We cannot do anything against the truth, but only for the truth... Our authority is for building you up, not for tearing you down." Paul closes with a reminder that his apostolic authority is not to tear the church apart but to build it up in truth and righteousness. Even his strong words flow from a heart of love and longing for their restoration.

The ministry of Christ is always meant to edify, encourage, and correct in love. Whether we lead, teach, parent, or serve —our goal must always be to build

people up in the truth.

Prayer Point: Ask God to make you a builder in His Kingdom—someone who strengthens others through truth, grace, and godly example.

# Conclusion: A Call to Maturity and Integrity

Paul's heart in this passage is clear: he wants to see the Corinthians stand strong in faith, free from compromise, walking in the power and purity of Christ. His final words are a fatherly call to maturity—a plea for authenticity and inner transformation.

This month, let us heed that call. Let us test our faith, walk humbly in Christ's strength, and live as agents of truth and grace. There is no room for lukewarm faith. God is raising up a pure and powerful church—a people who live not by appearances, but by the indwelling presence of Christ.



Let's continue to pray for this next generation—that they would not only hear the Gospel but become messengers of it to their own communities and beyond.


## Prayer Request: Mission & Milestones in Sri Lanka

#### A Milestone Celebration


