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THE MEANING OF WHITE & LIGHT IN FAITH

"For at one time you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as children of light." Ephesians 5:8 (NRSVUE)

It's February. Just a few weeks ago, we experienced snowy and cold days. The heavy snowfall blanketed the world in white, covering the earth and concealing everything beneath it. We enjoyed the beauty of the snow, yet it also meant staying home, shoveling tirelessly, and waking up to the sound of the plowing trucks clearing the roads. Despite the inconvenience, the snow transformed the landscape, covering dust, dirt, and stains, leaving the world pure and white.

THE MEANING OF WHITE & LIGHT IN FAITH

Biblically, the color white is often used as a metaphor for God's grace, righteousness, and salvation. It signifies purity, purification, and holiness. The psalmist writes, "Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow" (Psalm 51:7). Similarly, the prophet Isaiah proclaims, "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow" (Isaiah 1:8).

In the liturgical tradition, white represents Jesus Christ. This is why churches adorn the altar, lectern, and pulpit with white cloths during significant celebrations such as Christmas, Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord, Transfiguration Sunday, Easter Sunday, and Eastertide.

White, as the color of Christ, symbolizes the true light of God shining upon the world. The Sundays and seasons associated with white are deeply connected to the imagery of light. For example, Christmas and Epiphany feature the guiding starlight that led the wise men. The prophet Isaiah calls out, "**Arise, shine**" (Isaiah 60:1), while the account of Jesus' baptism describes the heavens opening and the Holy Spirit descending like a dove, illuminating the earth with heavenly light. The Transfiguration story further emphasizes this theme: "**Jesus' face shone like the sun, and**

his clothes became white as light" (Matthew 17:2).

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THE MEANING OF WHITE & LIGHT IN FAITH

We believe that Jesus Christ is the true light. Light is bright, warm, and even intense. It nurtures growth and melts what is frozen. Light also brings to mind another powerful image—fire. Fire is often associated with the Holy Spirit and is represented by the color red, which signifies the blood of Christ. At first, white and red may seem like opposing colors, but in Christ, they become one. Through Jesus' sacrifice, God's redemptive power is given to us. As the well-known hymn "Nothing But the Blood of Jesus" (UMH 362) declares:

"O precious is the flow that makes me white as snow; No other fount I know; Nothing but the blood of Jesus."

Brothers and sisters in Christ, as we journey through February, I encourage you to reflect on your love for God, the Trinity. We have traveled through Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, and the Baptism of the Lord. God's gracious light has shone upon us through Jesus Christ. His grace is sufficient, and now is the time to share it with others.

Just as we sing, "O precious is the flow that makes me white as snow," let us become channels of God's grace, allowing His power to transform others. God's love can cleanse and renew, making all things white as snow. Let us embrace and share His light.
