### Living a Life of Thanks Giving

*Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ!*

November is, of course, always associated with Thanksgiving. But in this day and age it's often hard to find things to be thankful for. The news and social media are full of stuff that assaults the soul with a storm of negativity that makes giving thanks seems out of place. But, is it? Well, it depends on what you're thankful for and; to whom you're being thankful.



Two years ago, I read a book written by Ann Voskamp called *One Thousand Gifts*. The author asks, "What does it mean to live full of grace? To live fully alive?" from Friends in New Bern to RUMC

Andy and I were wracking our brains to figure out a way to use [the tithe RUMC sent] with the largest, but most direct impact. I'm acquaintances with the City Commissioner (Steve) and he's in the midst of getting the Fuller Group here. The Fuller Group spends 1-3 years in a devastated area rebuilding homes for free (as long as they have a place to stay with a commercial kitchen). They focus on lower income homes, the ones without insurance. Steve found a church to house the 50 people from Fuller Group but he needed a commercial kitchen, so with our donation of \$500 (plus from a few other individuals and Bosch donating the appliances), they'll now be able to build one! This will help build/restore between 50-70 homes this year! Amazing stuff. So just know by sharing our story and what's going on in New Bern... you helped to rebuild at a minimum 50 homes.

On Sunday evening, October 7, RUMC hosted community members who heard Theodora Scarato speak on the impacts of cell towers.

Henry Lavine, Friends of Rectortown leader, arranged a very informative set of presentations, discussion and concerns. At the end of the session, a petition recommending that the cell tower not be placed in the immediate Rectortown area was passed around for signatures. The group also heard from Claude Shock who provides designs and installs fiberoptic based connectivity for homes and business. There was a great deal of interest in Claude's proposed solutions. In the past few weeks, the cell tower provider, who was going to provide their proposed project, cancelled and said they were reassessing possible site locations.
