
FRIENDLY REMINDER



²⁰ So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ: be reconciled to God.

²¹ For our sake God made the one who knew no sin to be sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

¹As we work together with him, we entreat you also not to accept the grace of God in vain.

² For he says,

"At an acceptable time I have listened to you,
and on a day of salvation I have helped

³ We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry,



¹"Beware of practicing your righteousness before others in order to be seen by them, for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven.
