






- 10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power;
- ¹¹ put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil,
- flesh but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

- 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on the evil day and, having prevailed against everything, to stand firm.
 - 14 Stand, therefore, and belt your waist with truth and put on the breastplate of righteousness
- ¹⁵ and lace up your sandals in preparation for the gospel of peace.

- With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one.
- ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.






