From the Pastor

From worship as an event to worship as a lifestyle...

Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ! 660, brothers and sisters, because of God's mercies, I encourage you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice that is holy



and pleasing to God. This is your appropriate priestly service." (Romans 12:1, Common English Bible) Here's the same text as translated from the original Greek by Eugene Peterson, "So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: take your everyday, ordinary life — your sleeping, going-to-work, and walking-around life — and place it before God as an offering." (The Message)

In his book, The Air I Breathe: Worship As a Way of Life, Louie Giglio avers that "we're created to worship." Thus, worship isn't just a Sunday morning event that we attend — it's the way we live every moment of our entire lives as disciples of Jesus Christ who are "life-long learners influencing others to serve." (Virginia Annual Conference vision statement)

In his book, Shift, Phil Maynard says that the true purpose of worship is about honoring and glorifying God at both the corporate and the personal level. Corporately, we gather as a community of believers to praise God and to learn more about God; and to be challenged to grow in faith so we may commit more holistically to live as disciples of Jesus Christ. Remember that "glorifying" God is more than simply praising God — it's more about making God known in all the world through the things we say and do, and the ways in which and by which we love our neighbors as ourselves. And this is exactly what personal worship is all about.

The common liturgical flow of worship used by many churches around the world (including the United Methodist Church) designed to connect us with God goes something like this: gathering praise and prayer proclamation response to the word sending forth. This has remained pretty much the same for centuries. Yet, a recent Barna survey revealed that about 14 percent of adult believers admit that they've never experienced the presence of God in or out of church.

How about you? When and how have you experienced the presence of God in our worship services? How does our corporate worship experience affect your personal worship in the way you live your life? Would you be willing to be a more active participant in worship? How would that look? I'd love to hear your thoughts!
