From the Pastor

Labor Day and Annual Conference

Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ!

Can you believe it's already September? Where did the year go? When I was a kid, I'd always heard that time speeds up as you get older, but I never understood



that. I mean, an hour is an hour, right? While that's true, I'm now aware that the rate at which we experience that hour changes with circumstances—things like getting older. The hours do seem to fly by these days. At any rate, there's a couple of special events that'll happen this month.

Labor Day is on Monday, September 7th. Things will certainly look different this year as we gather for family and community celebrations in the midst of an ongoing pandemic; but the picnics, parades and other special events aren't what Labor Day is all about anyway. As we've said before, the first Labor Day parade occurred when 10,000 workers took unpaid time off to march from City Hall to Union Square in New York City on September 5th, 1882. This was an early attempt by the American work force to push back against the harsh and dangerous working conditions, long hours, and low wages that had evolved during the Industrial Revolution. Psalm 107 says that the Lord is good to his people; and verse 12 says God's people "stumbled, and there was no one to help them" (CEB). Twelve years later, help came to the American work force when Congress legalized the "working man's holiday" as a celebration of the true wealth of this nation—the laborers themselves.

The other special event is the 238th Session of the Virginia Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. Like Labor Day, Annual Conference will also look very different this year. Instead of a 3-day gathering of clergy and laity from all over Virginia, we'll meet online for just one day on Saturday, September 19th. Even though many of our church buildings remain closed, the church is—and always has been—open, and the work goes on. The Annual Conference Mission Offering this year will serve "a mixture of long-term mission partnership commitments as well as new mission opportunities" (vaumc.org/ac2020) within our conference and overseas; and Kits for Conference will collect cleaning, hygiene, and school kits for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR). Thank you all for your continuing support of our local and global Church and the missions and ministries we're committed to.

collection details still underway, but will very likely include the organization of regional, or district-wide, drop-off locations. More information will be forthcoming as the new plan is created and finalized.

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is currently focusing efforts on **Cleaning** Kits (aka Flood Buckets), Hygiene Kits, and School Kits. Cleaning kits provide supplies to help individuals and families clean up after flooding, hurricanes, tornadoes, and other natural disasters. Hygiene kits replace basic necessity items lost in a disaster such as toothbrushes, hand towels, and soap to help people stay clean and healthy. School kits include school supplies for children as they return to the classroom. Click on the kit name above to see item lists and assembly instructions.

If you prefer to make a financial contribution to enable UMCOR to purchase relief kits, you can contribute \$75 for each cleaning kit; \$12 for each health kit; and \$11 for each school kit. Additionally, UMCOR asks for \$1 per kit (\$3 for cleaning buckets) to cover processing and shipping and \$1 for toothpaste for each health kit. Please do NOT bring checks to Annual Conference. All checks (for processing and shipping, for toothpaste, and in lieu of providing kits) should be made payable to "Virginia Conference UMC," earmarked for "kits" and mailed to Treasurer, Virginia Conference of The United Methodist Church, P.O. Box 5605, Glen Allen, VA, 23058 any time prior to Annual Conference.


