From the Pastor

Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ!

LOVE is a popular theme in human literature and entertainment. It's portrayed in comedies, satires, dramas, and tragedies.



I'm sure you just about everyone can come up with lots of movie, television, and song titles with "love" in it. I thought of "The Love Boat" on television; and "The Love Bug" from movies. There's the "Tunnel of Love" at carnivals; and "love potions" guaranteed to fix you up with that special someone! There's "I Love Lucy" and "Love American Style". And, let's not forget the Beatles who sang that "love is all you really need". Let's face it — humanity is fascinated, thrilled, bewildered, and confused by the concept of "love".

February is sometimes thought of as the "love month" because of Valentine's Day. It's a time when we give cards and candies and roses and other gifts to that special someone asking them to be "our Valentine". It is fitting that this special day focused on love is right in the middle of *Epiphanytide*, which began on January 6th, and continues until *Transfiguration Sunday*, which is the last Sunday before *Ash Wednesday*. The theme during *Epiphanytide* is God's self-revelation to humanity through Jesus Christ. Epiphany, I think, is one of the greatest examples of love we've ever known — it's a divine Valentine's meant not for one person, but for every person every where in every age.

"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him won't perish but will have eternal life. God didn't send his Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through him" (John 3:16-17). God love us — and God wants us to love us too. Not just some of us — but all of us. It's easy to love those closest to us, and those who look, think, and act like us. But, what about those others — those who don't look, think, or act like we do – those others who don't vote like we do, or _____. Well, I'm sure you can fill in that blank with many other examples. God calls us to stretch out our arms to embrace those others too, just like Jesus did. Remember, there's no one beyond the reach of God's grace; and there's no one beyond the need of God's grace.


