### Thanksgiving Through Thanks Living

*Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ!*



November is always associated with Thanksgiving. But in this day and age it's often hard to find things to be thankful for. The news and social media are full of stuff that assaults the soul with a storm of negativity that makes giving thanks seem out of place. But, is it? Well, it depends on what you're thankful for, and to whom you're being thankful.

I read a book by Ann Voskamp several years ago called, *One Thousand Gifts*. In the book, the author asks, "What does it mean to live full of grace? *To live fully alive?*" Her answer came through writing down 1,000 things — big or small — that she was truly thankful for. 
