## From the Pastor

### United as One in Worship



*Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ!*

June is here, and that means it's time for the 240th session of the Virginia Annual Conference! And, we'll be meeting in person again! I'm very excited for the opportunity to gather with 3,000 + United Methodists as we worship, pray, and sing to God's glory! It's time to begin imagining and building a new post-COVID identity as we look forward with joyful expectation to what God will do through us in the world around us!

The theme of the Annual Conference this year is "United as One in Worship", based on John 4:24 which says, "God is spirit, and it is necessary to worship God in spirit and truth." This theme builds upon last year, which highlighted Bishop Lewis' understanding of John 17:20-23 of which she said, "this Scripture shares the importance of us being One." Unfortunately, we must face the fact that with the launching of the Global Methodist Church last month, and the path being made available for United Methodist congregations to become Global Methodist congregations, this vision is already in some jeopardy.

No matter what happens and who ends up where, I will stay firm in believing that in the end *missio dei* will prevail! 

# From the SPPRC **Welcome Pastor Lamb!**



**W**e will be welcoming Pastor Jonathan Lamb to Rectortown United Methodist at the end of June. Jonathan is a young and energetic pastor coming to us from Bridgewater UMC where he served as their Associate Pastor of Congregational Care and Youth Ministries where he organized Youth Group Events, taught Confirmation Class, and visited the local nursing homes. In 2021, he was ordained an elder in The United Methodist Church. He serves as the youth minister at Bridgewater United Methodist Church.

Prior to that, his first appointment was as a Pastor at Christ and Fields United Methodist Churches in Shenandoah, Virginia where he served from 2017-2020. Under his Pastoral leadership, Fields Church was successful in effecting handicap accessibility to meet the needs of their congregation and the community.

Jonathan's ministry has been shaped by Jesus' teachings in Matthew 22:37-39: *"You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: You must love your neighbor as you love yourself"* (Common English Bible). Jesus' words continue to shape Jonathan's ministry by guiding him to listen with compassion, share with others in joys and in heartaches, give freely of himself and his gifts, and love all those he meets.

Jonathan grew up in Luray, Virginia where his parents and extended family continue to live. He attended Eastern Mennonite University in Harrisonburg, Virginia and went on to Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky. Following seminary, Jonathan served as a hospital chaplain at Lynchburg General Hospital. As he enjoys spending time outdoors, Jonathan served five summers at Camp Overlook in his early twenties as a counselor and he continues to minister to children and youth at Camp as a volunteer chaplain in the summers.

Once settled here, you can expect to see him running and biking through the streets or enjoying a hike in the countryside. He is excited about this new time and looking forward to working with everyone at Rectortown and Middleburg UMC and in the surrounding communities.

Jonathan will be residing solo in the parsonage so I'm sure he will look forward to regular dinner invitations and visits with you all.

## RUMC Announces

### New Options for Donating Online or By Text

Now that fewer people are using checks or carrying cash, offering a safe means to give online ensures we're providing you the most convenient methods possible to offer a gift of support to our church.

As many of you stream our services online, we hope this will be more convenient than mailing a check, though you are welcome to continue to do so if you prefer.

Through our new online giving platform you have the ability to give one-time or set up automatic recurring gifts from a credit/debit card or through a bank ACH transaction. RUMC does pay a small transaction fee to process online payments, but we feel the fee is well worth the convenience.

If you choose, you are able to cover that fee for the church at the same time you give.

You may also designate a fund for your giving by selecting a drop-down list.

#### Next Steps for One-Time Gifts

- Going forward, if you'd like to give a one-time gift, simply give using Breeze instead of PayPal by going to RUMC's website giving page, clicking the "Give Now" button and following the instructions on the page.
- Or, text the amount you'd like to donate (example: 50) to 540-502-3377 and follow the prompts for a one-time set up. In the future, you'll simply be able to text the gift amount to our giving number and hit send!

#### Next Steps for Recurring Givers

- If you're a Recurring Giver in PayPal, first cancel the gift within their system.
- Then, go to RUMC's website giving page, clicking the "Give Now" button
- Enter the amount you'd like to give
- Click the dropdown that shows the words "one time gift" and select a different frequency from the menu (weekly, every two weeks, monthly, yearly)
- Select your Payment Method and click "Continue"
- Now, enter your Contact and Payment Information and choose if you would like to cover the processing fees
- Click the "Give \$" button

We believe these new tools will allow us to continue to serve you well. We want you to know we greatly appreciate you and your heart of generosity as you continue to support RUMC and our mission of serving our community and growing the kingdom of God.
