struggle with waiting. We all must wait, in line, for computers to restart and for customer service hotlines on our phones. We each must wait for something, and I'm




sure you can relate to my struggle too. While we go shopping in stores, we hear Christmas music, and when we flip through our television channels, we find Christmas movies. I enjoy all these things, but it does sometimes feel misplaced in the middle of November. I believe this is a small reminder of how we as people struggle to wait.

The Church calendar begins with the season of Advent; we associate the purple paraments or clothes used in worship and Advent wreath with this season. I remember thinking the purple color doesn't seem to fit with the themes of Christmas red, green, and snow. Advent is meant to prepare us for the coming of Christ Jesus. The Church has associated purple with preparation and self-reflection.

Advent is the season that prepares us for the second coming, the return of Jesus. He will make all things right at the end of time. While we also remember how God shared about Jesus first coming into the world. Advent is a season of waiting. I invite you to reframe this period of waiting as anticipation for Jesus.

This season, I plan to have an Advent Wreath at home; it can be something very simple as electric candles or skip the wreath altogether and have four or five candles in a line. The candles and wreath can serve as a reminder for you and me to wait with anticipation for Jesus. We can give thanks in the angel's declaration of Jesus' arrival too!
