## Americans tend to view international students positively, though some support limitations

U.S. colleges and universities resumed classes this fall with <u>fewer international students</u> than in recent years, according to some early projections. In the 2023-24 academic year, the United States had <u>more than 1.1 million</u> international students at its higher education institutions – an all-time high.

These forecasts follow the Trump administration's <u>temporary pause</u> and subsequent redesign of <u>the student visa interview process</u>, as well as its <u>efforts to deport some student activists</u>, among other moves.

Most Americans (79%) think it's good for U.S. colleges and universities to accept international students. That includes majorities of both Republicans and Democrats, according to a Pew Research Center survey conducted Sept. 2-8.

Still, sizable shares support certain restrictions on foreign students:

- Half support limiting the number of Chinese students coming to the U.S.
- Around four-in-ten or more support limiting the number of students from India, Nigeria and South Korea.
- 42% say the U.S. should be able to cancel the visas of international students who have criticized U.S. foreign policy. All of these views differ along partisan lines.
