Question: I have paphiopedilums that just will not bloom. They are growing well with good leaves and root structure, but no flowers. Most are Maudiae types with one multifloral. I have them on the bottom shelf in my greenhouse with 1,5k00-2000 footcandles. My cattleyas are on the top shelf and shade the paphs. Any advice?

Answer: I think the key to this is insufficient light. If the light levels you mention are what the cattleyas are getting, it is very likely that the paphiopedilums do not have enough light. Even if the paphiopedilums are getting 1,500-2,000 footcandles, that is on the low end for any that have multifloral species in their background. Of course, what is most important about light is not an instantaneous maximum reading but light integrated over the entire day. If that were not the case, none of those plants imported into England long ago would never have even flowered. You need to look at

how heavily shaded your plants are, and for how much of the day during the winter when the sun angle is low in the3 sky. What might be fine light levels during the summer could be quite dark during the winter and that is the most critical time for getting these multifloral hybrids the light levels they need to flower. Also check your night temperature where the plants are growing. The multifloral species need somewhat cooler nights (mid-50s F) during the winter months for best performance. **Bottom line - give them light!**

March at Selby Gardens

Flower, Poetry, and Light - March 13 through June 26 The works of Robert Mapplethorpe and Patti Smith

If not for a series of chance moments, Mapplethorpe and Smith might not have met. This symbiotic relationship is depicted in a rare and riveting exhibition. Selby will showcase their life together from '67 until each found success as an established artist. Mapplethorpe's evocative work in black-and-white photography was initially honed with a simple Polaroid camera. He was known for his chronicaling of nudes and the counterculture of New York City. But Mapplethorpe, who was working with artistic collages and designs when he first met Smith, also photographed stunning still lifes, including flowers, with a special eye for orchids.

This exhibition features Mapplethorpe photographs of orhids, hyacinths, and irises, along with excerpts of Smith's poems and lyrics on flowers and nature, in dialogue with new horticultural installations inspired by

Newsletter). Some members have already agreed to serve in some of these capacities, so most jobs will be easy to accomplish.


