Continuing Professional Bail Bond Education 2025

Arkansas classifies felonies from most severe to least as **Capital**, **Class Y**, **Class A**, **Class B**, **Class C**, **Class D**, and **Unclassified**, each with specific prison sentence ranges, from life/death for Capital/Class Y (e.g., murder, rape) to up to six years for Class D (e.g., grand theft auto). Penalties also include significant fines, with Class Y penalties being the most severe (10 years to life or death) and Class D penalties capping at six years and a \$10,000 fine.

- **Capital Felony Murder:** Death or life imprisonment without parole.
- **Class Y Felony:** 10 to 40 years, or life in prison (e.g., rape, murder, child exploitation).
- **Class A Felony:** 6 to 30 years, plus potential fine (e.g., aggravated robbery, aggravated assault).
- **Class B Felony:** 5 to 20 years, plus potential fine (e.g., manslaughter, certain drug possession).
- **Class C Felony:** 3 to 10 years, plus potential fine (e.g., criminal use of property).
- **Class D Felony:** Up to 6 years, plus potential fine (e.g., burglary, grand theft auto).
- **Unclassified Felony:** Penalties defined by the specific statute defining the crime.
