Opportunities!

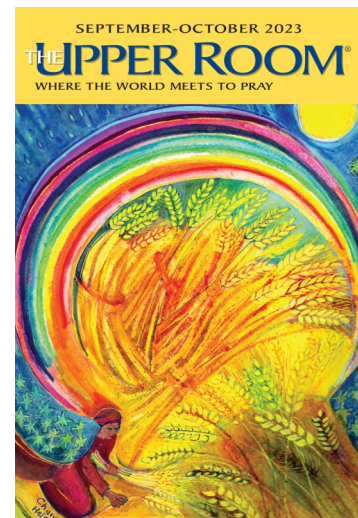
There are several ways for someone to participate on the worship team here at Cross in the Desert. Here are a few that require very little time commitment.

We are continuing to run lower than originally planned on our income/giving, but we have also been running lower on expenses primarily due to the loss of our janitorial services and adjustments to our plans for staffing. We've had the Music Director position and janitorial services open for quite some time. The new Pastor's salary is a significant reduction in expenses for us. Even though we have now contracted for janitorial services again and have hired a new Music Director, our year-end prognosis looks significantly better.

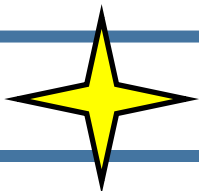

The fact that prayer was a natural habit for Jesus has profound implications for us today. Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians 5:17 that we should pray without ceasing. How do we do this in the post modern world? Brother Lawrence lived in a monastery and wanted to do more than regular prayers and so learned to pray even when working in the kitchen. Eventually, he said that, for him, there was no difference between the time of business and the time of prayer. Some people use the breath prayer and there are many different ways to pray. You can pray in the desert and on the mountain. The Jesus Prayer is described in a book called *The Way of a Pilgrim*. It does not matter how young, old or busy you are, prayer changes you and your life. Prayer involves not only asking God but also listening to God.

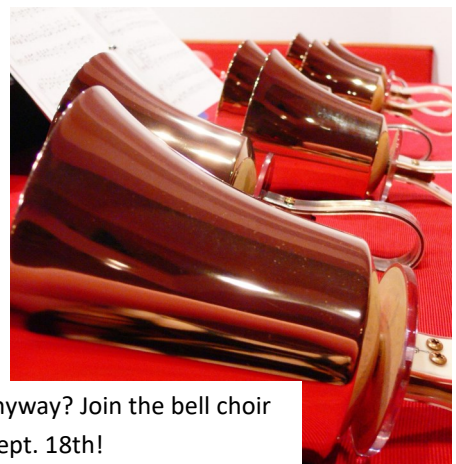

Please bring any donations to the designated area in Fellowship Hall, or to the office during the week. Thanks!

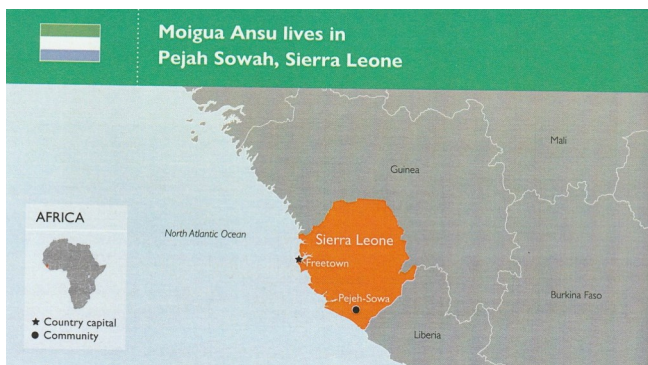
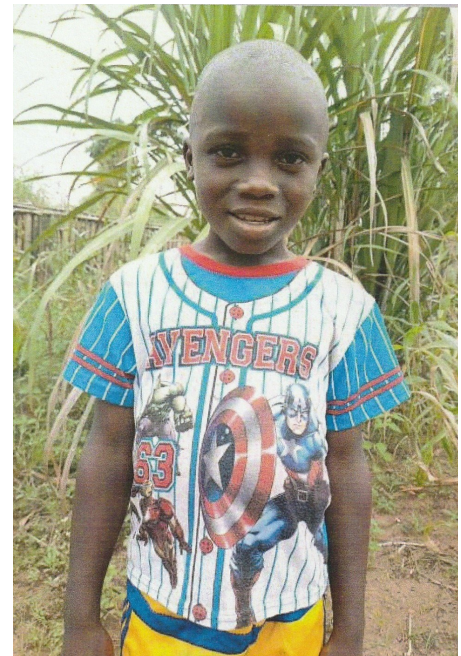


Meet Our New World Vision Child!

In response to the devastating fires which have ripped through Hawai`i in the last few days, a special giving link has been set up at the Conference center. As United Methodists, we want to bring our resources to the table in the most effective way possible; as such, 100% of all you give will go towards helping the people of Hawai`i.
