Dear Beloved Community,

As the election season draws nearer, it's not uncommon for emotions to run high, worries to surface, and anxieties to multiply. Amid this challenging time, I am writing to remind you of the steadfast foundations of our faith, which call us to uphold a spirit of sanity, peace, and unwavering trust in God's plan.

September 29th is T-shirt Sunday!



Saturday Afternoon at the Movies



LET'S TALK ABOUT JESUS....

"And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating what he had done." Genesis 2:3

It's Labor Day! Hard to believe the last official day of the summer season is here. For many Americans it is a day off from work, a chance to cook-out and hang-out.

A day off from labor was not a new concept when President Cleveland signed a bill into law designating the first Monday in September "Labor Day" in 1894. As we Judeo-Christians know, this concept of a day of rest was first declared by God. God showed us by resting the seventh day after creating the world and He deemed the day of rest holy. He didn't call it Labor Day - He called it the Sabbath.

Sabbath is not a day of tribute to workers, it's a day of tribute to their Maker. It's a day to rest our body while renewing our mind by making the focus of the day our Maker and our relationship with Him. The Sabbath should put our focus on the opportunity to meet with God.

What does your Sabbath typically look like? Are you truly focused on God, beyond perhaps an hour or so of worship at church?

We are created in God's image and he modeled for us a way of life that makes sense for how we are created. At the end of each day, stop. Refresh yourself by taking time to think a bit about your day and to notice where God was in it and where you were blessed. And after six days, take a whole day off and spend it pausing and reflecting on how really great and good God is. God gives us seven days a week, we can give him at least one.

Dear Lord, we want to honor You by practicing Sabbath rest. Show us how to live this way. Meet each one of us in our time of contemplation, reflection and worship. In Jesus mighty and sacred name we pray, Amen.



Pastor Mel introduced us to the Litoměřice UMC some years ago. We have been supporting them with \$1,000/year in recent years. They are helping Ukranian refugees as part of their ministry.

The church was founded in 1921 after three days peaching in the YMCA. In 1923 they bought a house which used to be a liquor pub to be used as a church. The opening service was based on 2COR 6:16, "For we are a temple of the living God," and the members of Litoměřice UMC try to fulfill this. Besides worship services there are home groups, sport events for kids and teen agers, and local mission work with a maternity center, kindergarten and prison. The preacher is Filip Jandovsky.

Please lift up the congregation for continued inspiration and blessing in their worship and outreach programs.
