 - i. Transferring interests in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th Plaintiffs;
 - ii. Altering the beneficial and/or equity rights of the 1st Defendant in the Plaintiffs.
 - iii. Taking step(s) to give effect to any agreement in any way or manner howsoever that alters (or put(s) in a position to alter) the 1st Defendant's ownership, equity, share capital structure, rights or interest in the assets of the Plaintiffs.

4. AND FOR SUCH FURTHER ORDER or other orders as this Honourable Court may deem fit to make in the circumstances of this case.

AND UPON READING the affidavit in support of the Motion Ex parte sworn to by Olufunmbi Kehinde, Female, Nigerian Citizen, a Legal Counsel in the employment of the 1st Plaintiff of 16 Idowu Martins Street, Victoria Island, Lagos and filed at the Federal High Court Registry, Ikoyi – Lagos.

AND AFTER HEARING Bode Olanipekun (SAN) with Adeola Akinyemi Counsel for the Plaintiff/Applicant move in terms of the application.

This is an Ex parte application brought by the Applicant pursuant to Sections 97 and 98 of the Sheriff and Civil Process Act Cap S. LFN, 2004 Order 6 Rules 17, Order 28 Rules 3 of the Rules of this Court 2019.

The Motion has prayed the Court for reliefs as contained on the Motion Paper.

 - 2. That leave is granted to the Applicants to serve the 1st and 2nd Defendants the Originating Summons and other processes filed in this suit before appearance of counsel on their behalf by courier service or speed post at the following addresses outside the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court:
 - 1st Defendant Walkers Corporate Limited, 190 Elgin Avenue, George Town Grand Cayman KY1-9001, Cayman Islands.
 - 2nd Defendant 40 Bank Street, London, E14 5NR.
 - That an Order of Interim Injunction is granted restraining the Defendants (pending the hearing of the Motion on Notice for Interlocutory Injunction dated 4th April, 2022 filed in this suit) from

interfering with the res of this suit or carrying out any action that will foist a fait accompli on this Honourable Court in any way, form or manner, including but not limited to:

- Transferring interests in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th Plaintiffs;
- ii. Altering the beneficial and/or equity rights of the 1st Defendant in the Plaintiffs.
- iii. Taking step(s) to give effect to any agreement in any way or manner howsoever that alters (or put(s) in a position to alter) the 1st Defendant's ownership, equity, share capital structure, rights or interest in the assets of the Plaintiffs.
- 4. That this suit is hereby adjourned to the 1st day of June, 2022. The Defendants shall be put on Notice
