The Where of Prayer

In the end, prayer grants us the quiet confidence that we are seen, known, and loved by a God who is always present.

We will see how this connects with the most performed and persistent prayer we know... "Our Father, who art in Heaven...."

When we were in Chicago for twenty years, we developed close relationships. We had "our people". But then we moved to the U.P., and those relationships faded. What had changed? It was the distance that undermined these once close relationships. Long-distance relationships are hard to maintain because humans need closeness and immediacy. We felt this with Covid and those awful Zoom meetings. While this was better than no connection, there is something artificial and unsatisfying about the whole thing. It is the distance that diminishes the reward.

In prayer, many of us imagine we are telegraphing our prayers to a distant God in Heaven. Fortunately, God's excellent hearing ensures that He always hears our requests, which is comforting. The first phrase in the Lord's prayer would seem to support our imagination, "Our Father, who art in heaven."

But is God a distant God? I have a long-distance relationship with a friend, and occasionally, we connect through email, and every couple of years, I visit. Most of the time, he is in my heart but not on my radar screen. Those who are in my space get my attention and my affection.

But what if our imaginations have it wrong? What if God is not distant at all? In the original language of the Lord's prayer, the Greek word for Heaven is "Ouranos." Notice it is plural. It is not "Heaven" but the heavens. When we stand outside, the heavens surround us. We call it the atmosphere that extends from the top of the sky to the horizon's edge. It only ends where our feet touch the ground. I am still inside the heavens if I move 100 feet or 1000 miles.

The Lord's prayer, drawing from Jewish cosmology, does not isolate God up in Heaven (although God is there also). God is in our heavens. God is in our space.

This means prayer is more like a conversation with a friend over a picnic table than a telegram. The reward is the experience of God in our space.

To have this experience, we must reimagine where God exists in our relationship. God is not distant. God is as close as the air we breathe.

But we also need a practice that connects us to God in our space. I struggle to be present with people when trapped in my thoughts. I might think about my work, hobbies, or a thousand other things and pay little attention to the person beside me. It takes a conscious choice to focus on them and their words. When I do this, the person comes alive in the present in my space. The same is true of God.

When Jesus says to go into your closet and shut the door, he invites us to focus our attention on the God with us. When I pray this way, I experience God. Typically, I focus on my breathing. This gets my overactive mind to quiet down and be present in the present. When my mind quiets down, it is like the clouds part, and I experience God in my space. I have my reward with a God who is never far away.

All Saints Day – November 1

All Saints Day celebration has a long history in the worship life of the Christian Church. It began as a commemoration of the martyrs who had died for the faith, and it has since become a day when we honor and remember those who, in death, have joined the Church Triumphant, as well as the faithful saints of the present who serve Jesus Christ. Martin Luther held that all Christians are simultaneously sinner and saint --a sinner because of our rebellious nature, but a saint because of salvation in Jesus.
