




### Father's Day Prayer

### What is Pentecost All About?

The Protestant reformer, Martin Luther, once said, "The Christian Church is a mouth-house of God." So, whose words will the Church speak? Jesus' words to be exact. Words like the ones Jesus gave his church at ascension.



"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20).

But how do Jesus' words come to us? Enter the Holy Spirit and Pentecost. The name "Pentecost" comes from the Greek word for "fiftieth." In the Old Testament, Pentecost was a harvest festival, the ingathering of winter wheat (known as Shavuot or the Feast of Weeks). It began on the fiftieth day after Passover. It was also a day to celebrate Moses receiving the Law and God's Covenant on Mt. Sinai amidst wind and fire.

In the New Testament, Acts 2 records the first Pentecost after Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension. Once again there was a mighty rushing wind, fire, God's word, and a harvest. Only, this time, the fire came in flaming tongues over the disciples' heads. God's word was declared by St. Peter to thousands gathered in Jerusalem from around the Mediterranean. Each person heard in their own language that Jesus had died and rose for them. It was a joyous harvest – not of wheat for winter – but of people, from all nations for eternal salvation! After all, God shows no partiality or racism. Jesus died for all nations. These were the signs that the Holy Spirit had been sent to the Church as Jesus promised (John 14:15-26 and 16:12-14).

Today, Pentecost is a day for hearing that Jesus died and rose again – for you! It's also a day for speaking this good news to others. If the Christian Church is to speak God's word, breath is needed. No breath, no words. At Pentecost Jesus sends, or rather breathes, the Holy Spirit upon his Church.

The Holy Spirit's job is pointing people to Jesus' death and resurrection, calling people to faith in this gospel, and breathing faith in Jesus into your hearts. In other words, the Holy Spirit makes *you* holy by giving you the forgiveness of sins Jesus won for you on the cross. Pentecost is a yearly reminder that the Holy Spirit gives you ears to hear God's word and mouths to pray, praise, and give thanks. God speaks and we hear the word of God, each in our own language: Jesus died, rose, ascended, and sends the Holy Spirit for you!

#### New Business:


- Job Description for Website Manager -Council reviewed. Norma makes a motion to approve, Kaye seconds - approved.

Rev. Jon Anderson was the keynote speaker who spoke about rural ministry. At a time when we hear so much about the decline of church in America, Rev. Anderson's presentation proved to be very encouraging. Yes, church is changing but change brings new opportunities. We will continue to answer Jesus' command to love each other as Jesus loves us.

The 2026 Synod Assembly will be held in one day hybrid format and will return to in person in 2027.

#### **Alger Baby Closet Collection**

During June, there will be a basket in the narthex to collect items for the Alger Baby Closet. Here are excerpts from their request letter.



The LMAS District Health Department, in partnership with the Great Start Collaborative (GSC), Early On, Community Action Alger and Marquette (CAAM), and Early Head Start, is sustaining an Alger Baby Closet (ABC), located at the LMAS Alger Office.

ABC assists expectant and new families with children from birth to age 3 with prenatal services, community education programs, and essential care items.

The ABC program utilizes an "earn as you learn" process for obtaining 'baby bucks' that can be redeemed for diapers, pack-n-plays, blankets, safety items and other essential care items. While baby bucks can be earned by any community member, the ABC aims to serve families with the highest need.

Baby bucks can be earned by participating and attending WIC appointments, immunization appointments, breast feeding classes, nurse and doctor visits (child and mom), Early On and/or Maternal Infant Health Program referral and visit, Families First home visiting, Early Head Start, play groups at Great Start Collaborative literacy programs, and health promotion

activities and education (including smoking cessation assistance).

We know that when families struggle, children suffer. The ABC was created by neighbors like you, who care enough to help young parents in our community.

We invite you to visit the ABC at the LMAS District Health Department (E9526 Prospect Street, Munising) any time during business hours (Monday-Thursday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.).

Please join us in helping every infant in Alger County have the essentials for care and safety.
