Quilts - You Wrap Them With Love

When natural disasters strike or war drives families from their homes, our hearts ache with compassion but we don't know how to help. Making Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilts is a tangible way to express love to our neighbors in need. Quilts can be used as warm bedding, simple tents or floor coverings. Fela Mbahibwe used to have a small house and a garden, her children attended school. Then, last spring, everything went sideways. Her village in the eastern region of the Democratic Republic of Congo was caught in the crossfire of ongoing conflict in the region. Her husband was tragically killed.

"I lost my life just like that," she said.
"We just ran. We didn't carry anything. No
utensils, we just took the children. Others died
while trying to run. We just continued running."
Tied together by Fela's coat to avoid separation,
the family arrived at a displacement camp near
the city of Goma. That is where your
compassion found the young family.

Thankfully, LWR has a long history of working in Eastern Congo. Despite ongoing violence and challenges, your support reached the crowded camps around Goma with desperately needed aid. Your love in Eastern Congo, among 7 displacement camps and 3,030 tented households, has distributed 9,090 quilts.

"Thank you for all the work you did for us." Fela said, "we don't have any other help, we only have you." For someone who has lost everything, knowing that someone cares for them can be the single inspiration to keep going.

Along with international destinations, 60,465 quilts were shipped after hurricanes. This included 43,520 to Florida, 13,645 to North Carolina, and 3,300 to Tennessee.

Eden's dedicated group of quilters meet at the church every second Thursday of the

month (except in the summer). The group cuts fabric into squares, arranges and sews the squares together, attaches the backing, and ties the quilts together with yarn. This devotion often continues in the quilters' homes.

Each fall, the quilts are displayed in the sanctuary for the "Blessing of the Quilts." Then the quilts are securely packed in cardboard boxes and brought to a boxcar (generally in Escanaba) for shipment to Lutheran World Relief.

Since 2003, the Eden Quilting Group has completed 607 quilts, including 27 assembled in 2025. Along with sending to Lutheran World Relief, quilts are also prayerfully presented to Eden's high school graduates and to those in need locally.

The Country Circle of Eden got this started years ago, long before 2003. When they were all gone, Sylvia Moe kept it going. Donations such as cotton fabric, sheets (for quilt backing) and thread are always welcome. We have plenty of yarn for now.

Now there is a core group that keeps quilting, including Karen Derwin, Lynn DeRoche, Judy Erickson, Margaret Gosselin, Jean Hayes. Joanie Hinsa, Billie Lindquist, Debbie Perttula, Helen Scheunemann, Candy Simonen, and anyone who would like to join.

Thank you to Candy, Donna, Joanie, Lynn, and Jean who packed up the quilts and to Curt & Judy Erickson who will take them to Gladstone, to the boxcar to be shipped.

If you can use a pair of scissors or tie a knot, there is something for you to do to help. All are welcome, even if you can only join occasionally. Along with being productive, it's a wonderful time of fellowship and (of course) coffee.
