Program: Jon Kimsey got to introduce today's program and he couldn't be prouder. Dalilah Fuentes, the Boys and Girls Club Youth of the Year last year went on to win state honors and regional honors in Los Angeles and then on to New York, where she competed for National Youth fo the Year. Her talk was entitled "Dalilah's Journey." That journey began in



Mexico, the land of her birth, but much focused on the role that the Boys and Girls Club in shaping Dalilah into the person she is.

At times, full of humor and at others, full of pathos, Dalilah was shy girl when she first started coming to the Boys and Girls Club. She would go in the corner and do her homework, rather than joining in all of the activities. It was the encouragement of staff at the Club that changed her. They asked her how she was—and meant it—and Dalilah had a lot pent up, including leaving much of her family in Mexico. Gradually, she came out of her shell and started involving herself in Club activity, partly because her friends were doing it.

Throughout her efforts to become Youth of the Year, she had a mentor at the Club who encouraged her and got her to be herself and to share her story. In fact, there were many at the Boys and Girls Club who helped shape her. But Dalilah is also a kid and enjoyed things like going to Universal Studios when she was at the Regionals in Los Angeles. She shared that one of the people who was there with her was afraid of heights but did not let on to Dalilah and they went on some challenging rides, but she was there for Dalilah.

Dalilah has gone to college at Pacific Northwest Christian in Kennewick and is a night manager at Taco Bell. At school, now Dalilah wants to come back to be staff at the Boys and Girls Club and be that inspiration to kids that present and past staff has been for her. At work, Dalilah shared the support she received from Taco Bell, including going to a big meeting of corporate managers, where she spoke about her journey.

No one could be a better salesperson for the Boys and Girls Club and its impact on kids than Dalilah. Thank you, Jon Kimsey, for your role in being one of those leaders with the Boys and Girls Club who inspires kids.
