Program: Art King introduced Steve Lehto, a Navy man from 1970-197, who grew up in Dallas, Ore, went to Western Oregon University (go Wolves!) and then spent 48 years in the grocery industry. Steve got

involved in veterans' affairs in Tulsa, OK and has continued it since he moved to the Tri-Cities. He is the mentor-coordinator for the Benton County Veterans Therapeutic Court. When he started in Tulsa, there were only 10 such courts and there are



now 500. The Benton County Veterans Therapeutic Court transforms the lives of justice-involved veterans by reframing the traditional legal process through treatment and mentorship. He works with the Columbia Basin Veterans Center (CBVC). The CBVC has been working since 2009 to ensure that veterans in the Tri-Cities and surrounding areas receive the benefits they have earned. They work closely with the Veterans Administration and other non-profits to make this happen.

Steve, the CBVC Mentor Coordinator assists the court while providing mentors for each participant. He conducts regular training, forums, and continued assistance to ensure that each veteran is given the chance to move forward in life. There have been 60 graduates and low recidivism. The court has saved Benton County \$360,000. Right now, there are 19 in the program (and it's tough) with 21 mentors, including Art King. Mentors walk along with veteran from day one. They help these veterans get through this tough and demanding program. Steve has seen men and women turn their lives around through this program and shared one story about a West Richland individual that fit the bill. Every single WR police officer came to this person's graduation.

The CBVC, as a 501c3 non-profit, welcomes donations from the community. In turn, it offer community events, such as the "No Veteran Stand Alone" gala each summer, the Veterans Community Golf Classic in the summer, the Tri-Cities Veterans Resource Expo and Stand Down in the fall, and a variety of social events for the veterans, such as Crossfit, Opposite

Action Cycling, Vets on the Green (golfing), Fishing with Vets, Vets on the Slopes (skiing and snowboarding), Women Veteran Night Out, and Coffee Bunker NW. The CBVC has also done some community outreach with Second Harvest and Ben Franklin Transit.

Thanks, Art and Steve, for all you do for our veterans.

Kennewick Kiwanis Foundation Scholarship Awards Night

Last Wednesday, the Kennewick Kiwanis Foundation awarded 23 students scholarships totaling \$50,000, the most in the 28-year history of the Foundation. Foundation President, Chuck DeGooyer, was Master of Ceremonies, and most of the Foundation board got to present certificates to the winners in attendance.

Seven scholarships were awarded to graduating high school seniors and 15 went to college students who had previously won Foundation scholarships out of high school. High school scholarship winners will graduate this spring from Kennewick, Kamiakin, Southridge, River View and Liberty

Christian/Tri-Tech high schools.

These 22 students will attend schools from near (Columbia Basin College) to far (Central Methodist University in Missouri). Of the 23, six will attend the University of Washington and four Grand Canyon University in Arizona. Six will expect to major in some form of health care, five in some form of engineering, and four in business.
