Ideas

- Share the types of difficult behavior you've experienced.
- Role play protecting yourself, the student, and others if someone begins to hit, kick, etc.
- Demonstrate safe ways to get out of bites and holds.
- Share your plan to find a lost child.
- Share the importance of reconciling, recapping, and reporting.
