To ensure that every child in the Bellevue School District who needs food will receive a pack of food to bring home for the weekend.

Our Impact

Backpack Meals entered its 14th year of taking on the challenge of feeding kids experiencing food insecurity within the Bellevue School District. Backpack Meals board and volunteer staff committed to this pledge every year because we know that kids cannot learn without nourishing food. We know that 18% of children in BSD live in families with food insecurity. That is the equivalent of 3,500 students! We want all children to be nourished so that they can succeed in school.

Backpack Meals for Kids is the only organization in Bellevue to put real food into the hands of children for the weekend. Not only does the food provide nourishment, but it also tells children that their community cares.

Studies prove that children who receive food to take home on Friday show improved test scores.


35,500 packs of food were given to 1000 preschool, elementary school and high school students


Our Future

Since 2011, when we began feeding children, the numbers have increased from 60 children served each week to 1000 children today. With this growth, the need to change our structure became clear. We needed dedicated staff in addition to our wonderful volunteer team.

For the last two years, Backpack Meals for Kids has purchased the weekend food packs from Backpack Brigade. We have a well-organized and collaborative working relationship with Backpack Brigade. They will begin delivering the packs in September of the 2024-2025 school year. And during the first quarter of 2025, Backpack Brigade will assume all functions of Backpack Meals for Kids. At that time, Backpack Meals for Kids will dissolve.
