The Benton County Master Gardeners Associations provides education and training in a wide variety of sustainable gardening skills, plant and insect identification, local food, and native species.

At the Benton County Fairgrounds' main south entrance, Benton County Master Gardeners have created seven display gardens, each with its own theme. The *Deer Resistant* and *Drought Resistant gardens* show ways to address those common problems. The *Bird Support and Pollinator gardens* contain plants that help our local wildlife. Side-by-side on the east side of the Floral Courtyard are two contrasting gardens, one full of our local Native Plants Garden and the other a charming traditional *English Cottage Garden*, each showcasing

its own style of beauty. Finally, on the west side of the Floral Courtyard is the *Children's Garden*. It explodes with a rainbow of color on one end and a sensory garden on the other, encouraging children to touch and smell. Small teams of Master Gardeners design and maintain each of these gardens to help local gardeners make their own dream gardens.
