## What is BSCWT?

The Brentwood Schools Christian Worker Trust (BSCWT) is an educational Christian charity which was set up in 1991. The Trust exists to serve schools in the Brentwood area by providing Christian learning and support. It's all about Christians serving schools.

BSCWT is an expression of the local Christian community and is committed to building a positive partnership between schools and churches.

## What do we do?

The work of BSCWT in schools focuses on two main areas:

1. Spiritual development – part of the aims of the National Curriculum, this is about helping pupils to develop their own insights, principles, beliefs, attitudes and values that will give them a sense of identity, meaning and purpose
2. Support – helping schools to provide pastoral care and support to pupils

To provide these services to schools, we are involved in five core activities:

### Pupil support

Providing a listening ear, one-to-one, and supporting small groups of pupils to explore issues such as self-harm, friendships and self-esteem.

### Assemblies

Presenting Christian reflections in thought-provoking and relevant ways.

### Clubs

Providing a safe place for pupils to make friends and develop social skills.

Enabling pupils to explore aspects of Christian faith in more depth.

### Lessons

Exploring Christian ideas, beliefs and experience on a variety of issues.

### 'Prayer Spaces'

creating interactive opportunities for pupils to reflect on big questions of life.

In some schools, this work is carried out by members of our team working as Chaplains. We are also committed to praying for our schools and to encouraging churches to develop other ways of serving their local school.

## Who is on our team?

The BSCWT team is made up of a small number of paid staff and a much larger group of volunteers. Some of these volunteers are our Associate Workers



in schools, while others are Trustees, Management Committee members and Church Reps. The staff team is made up of:



Sue Evans is one of our Schools Workers, focusing on primary schools. She joined our staff in 2007 and has a PhD in Philosophy as well as previous teaching experience.



Mary Thomas is one of our Schools Workers, focusing on secondary schools. She has been working with BSCWT since 1999 and is a qualified teacher.



Rosie Graham is one of our Schools Workers, working in primary and secondary schools. She joined our team in 2017 and has a degree in Applied Theology.



Fiona Mason is our Administrator. She joined our staff in 2007 and holds secretarial qualifications along with extensive experience in administrative and secretarial roles.



Ian Kemble is our Director of Schools Work. He has led our staff team since 2006, and is a qualified teacher and trainer.

## How is BSCWT Supported?

The Trust is supported by many local churches in the Brentwood area as well as by many individuals. Our work depends on their ongoing generosity, in addition to a small number of grants from other organisations.
