Still Serving Schools through ‘Lockdown’!

On 20th March, school buildings across the country closed down to all but a small number of staff, vulnerable pupils and children of key workers. Just a few days before, following government guidance, we closed the BSCWT office and our staff began working from home. However, while schools have continued to provide education to pupils remotely, so we also have been continuing to serve and support our local schools. We are so grateful to God for providing us with many opportunities to do this.

As we are all well aware, the last few months have been extraordinary and unprecedented in so many ways. But I am thrilled at how our team has responded to the challenge of finding ways to serve school pupils and staff. These ways have certainly been different to our ‘usual’ methods, and you can read about them in this newsletter, but we have found school communities – pupils, staff and parents - expressing their gratitude that we have stood with them during such difficult times.

‘Celebration’ Video!

Even if you haven’t seen our previous announcements, you will probably have guessed that we have cancelled our Annual Celebration, which was due to take place on 6th July! We’re really sad to be unable to hold this event, but we are excited to let you know that we’ve put together a short ‘Celebration’ video to share with you some of our highlights of the past year of serving schools.

It’s Your Move!

Our *It’s Your Move* project, led by Rosie, looks very different this year! What would normally be a 90-minute lesson with Year 6 pupils in their classes, has been adapted into a digital resource pack, able to be used by teachers with pupils in school or by pupils learning at home.



The resources are available at www.bscwt.org/iym and include videos and worksheets to help pupils explore the Changes, Challenges and Choices they may face as they move to their new school. The pack has been sent to 30 schools, along with nearly 1000 *It’s Your Move* books for pupils (see page 3).

A Year 6 teacher wrote this to us:

Remember Easter?!

At the end of last term, we had a full 3½-week timetable of Easter lessons booked in primary schools! *Sadness to Joy* is our infants’ lesson which tells the story of Easter through acting, interaction and dressing up; *Easter Cracked* is a workshop aimed at exploring the mysteries of Easter with older Juniors; and the *Easter Prayer Space* provides a reflective space for asking big questions around themes based in the Easter Story.



We managed a week of these projects before government guidance led to schools closing down to most staff and pupils. However, that was not the end of our involvement with schools at Easter: we were able to send out the lesson plans and resources to some schools for their teachers to adapt and use with their students wherever they were!

Finance Update from the Treasurers & Trustees

We continue to be thankful to all individuals, churches and charitable trusts for their continued support of the activities of the Trust with the young people in our Brentwood schools.

We have come to the end of another financial year and we are pleased to report that the Trust finances are in a healthy position. We have been blessed with some legacies which have had a significant impact on our finances. Please pray for wisdom for the Trustees as they consider how the money will be spent. Receipts were £90,058 which included a budgeted transfer from unrestricted funds of £24,109. Payments were £89,129. At the year end there was a surplus of £928.


We were blessed to receive a further grant of £5,000 from the Mulberry Trust and we are very grateful for their ongoing support. We are busy preparing the annual accounts for presentation to our Independent Examiner.
