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#### 20 Years of Schools Work

Sadly, this will be the last newsletter article I will write for the Trust. I am leaving the work after 20 years to move down onto the south coast to be nearer our son and his every growing family. I have very mixed feelings about this decision, some sad, some excited, as I know God will have something new for me to get involved in.

When I first felt the call to come into this work I was visiting an assembly at St Martin's School with the schools work leader at the time, to get a feel for the work. God made it obviously clear to me that He wanted me to step out in faith, give up the job I had and become a volunteer for the Trust. Something of His passion and love for young people was instantly imparted to me and hasn't left me, which is why the decision to leave has been so hard to make. I worked as a volunteer for a couple of years, and was employed by the Trust following an interview on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2001.

I have seen many changes throughout my time with the Trust, including 10 office moves – at one stage we were using a coffee shop in Brentwood for our team meetings when we didn't even have an office! Lots of volunteers have come and gone, and staff have changed, as have Trustees, but the heartbeat of God has never changed throughout my time here - His strong love for the children and young people in our schools. The work has expanded, the way we work has evolved and the number of schools we support has increased.

I have gone from visiting lots of primary schools and a few secondary schools, mainly for assemblies and a few clubs, to focusing my work in 3 secondary schools, one of which I have become deeply involved in pastorally. This is an answer to years of praying, as I felt pastoral work was what God really had placed on my heart all those

I will miss the team I work with, at times they have been so much more to me than work colleagues. I don't believe my heart for BSCWT will ever leave me, and I will watch from afar to see how God progresses His work in the coming years. He has been completely faithful to me, seen me through many ups and downs, and equipped me to work with Him all these years. I know He will continue His faithfulness to all who serve Him in the schools, provide for all that is needed, and lead the Trust on into all He has prepared. Mary Thomas, Schools Worker

#### Easter Prayer Space

At the end of March, we ran an Easter Prayer Space with the years 5 & 6 children of Ingatestone Junior School in Ingatestone Parish Church. The Prayer Space consisted of 5 different activity areas all based in the Bible stories associated with Lent and Easter. We started with Jesus' temptation in the desert, thinking about what we need to turn away from and leave behind; next was Jesus' entry into Jerusalem,



reflecting on what gives us direction in life; then we considered Jesus washing his disciples' feet, washing each others' hands and thinking about what we can do for others; the Crucifixion brought us to the topic of forgiveness and what we want to say sorry for; and finally the Resurrection and dreaming of our hopes for the future. #### 6th Form Exam Stress Workshop

In early April, Mary, Ian and I led an exam stress workshop for 6th Form students at Shenfield High School. With pressure of exams, large amounts of revision, coursework deadlines, plus future choices and decisions all coming together at the same time, it can often make the build up to A-Level and BTEC exams a stressful and worrying Also, for many students the thought of stepping into the unknown, leaving school for the final time, adds to the challenge. The structure of school life will no longer provide a regular routine.

Some students are confident and look forward to the change. However, for many it is a difficult time of uncertainty. It was a privilege for us to share some insights into how to cope with exam anxiety and provide some practical solutions, but also to reinforce the belief that there is a plan for each of their lives, that when some doors close, others open, and to give some reassurance.

Feedback from the students included the following comments:

"I have learned not to worry as much as I do and how I should prepare for exams and that I'm not alone in the way I'm feeling."

"Fiona, lan and Mary were really easy to talk to."

"It calmed me down about the future, not just about exams, but in general life experiences."
