#### Teacher's Notes

- The activities we've included are designed to support spiritual, personal and social development.
- These suggestions are for use by pupils on their own, with others in class or as a whole school project.
- There are ideas to help both explore and reflect on the story and it's relevance to us

Bible references: Acts 2:43-47 and Acts 4:32-37 and John 13:1-17.

Aims: To explore and reflect on what Jesus taught about love and how the disciples put this into action, so pupils can link it to their own lives in exploring what love is and does.

thinas to do!

Focus: Exploring descriptions of love and Jesus' message about love.

Activities: 1. Love slogans 2. Hearts and Hands 3. Challenging Love

Resources: Worksheet, templates, light card/plain paper, pencils, felt pens, scissors.

- In the Teacher's Pack there is an additional picture of the slogans for use on a whiteboard etc. if needed.
- There is an extra hand template for simplicity and speed, if needed.
- There are 3 puzzles in the challenge section, with increasing order of difficulty.

thinas to do!

Focus: For pupils to consider their own thoughts about love and what love 'looks' like.

Activities: 1. 'Love is...' hearts 2. Discuss and Share

Resources: Children draw own hearts or use heart template provided to print. Magazine or printed pictures, felt pens, scissors, glue, string or wool.

- The 'Love is...' hearts can be displayed or used in a number of ways according to your classroom setting.
- The discussion starts with the reflective questions from the assembly, then moves on to thinking about how we can share.

1 thing to do!

Focus: To identify and enact real life examples of Saint Paul's description of love.

Activities: 1. Explore love statements from the Bible to share with the school.

Resources: Love statements from 1 Corinthians 13, poster making equipment

Interesting point: The love statements in 1 Corinthians 13 are very popular to use at weddings.

#### 1: Love slogans

On the sheet attached are some different puzzles to help remind you what we thought about in the assembly film:


- (1) Missing letters

- (3) Crossword


When you have the answers, see whether you can remember the rest of the story and ideas from the Assembly.




## 1 : Love Slogans

### 3: Challenging Love (2) - Code Breaker



Some activities to help your class to explore the ideas in our assembly

#### 1: 'Love is...' hearts

Write, draw or cut out pictures of actions that are ways of showing love. Decorate the hearts with the template provided on the next page.



You can use the shapes to:

- create 3D hearts to hang in the classroom.
- collect in a special container that pupils can look at and read.
- put up as a class display.



#### 2: Discuss and share

- 1. Spend some time thinking about the questions in the assembly film:
- How would you feel if you were part of a community like Jesus' friends were?
- How does it feel when you know someone loves you?
- What does the story of Jesus washing his friends' feet tell us about love?
- Did you learn anything new about love today?
- 2. Focus on SHARING as a way of loving each other. Discuss the community Jesus' friends talk about in the assembly film – how they shared and experienced many things together.
- Can you remember what they shared things or shared experiences? (Land, things they owned, money, meals, visiting the Temple, miracles)
- What do you find easy to share?
- What do you find tricky to share?
- What difference does it make if you share?
- What difference does it make when you are having shared positive experiences with other people?
- How did Jesus' friends manage to share and love each other when they found it difficult?






#### 1: 'Love is...' hearts

Write, draw or stick pictures of actions that are ways of showing or doing love. If you want to make a 3D heart to hang, use 3 or more hearts, fold them in half and glue two together half back to back. Then glue another to the free half, back to back, and so on, joining the first and last to finish (see picture).

An activity to help your school to explore the ideas in our assembly

#### 1: What does LOVE look like?

Using the list below, assign different statements to each class.

- Each class discuss what their given statements could mean and think of examples of what this type of love could look like.
- Each class could create a poster to put up outside their classroom or all together in a big display LOVE.
- Each class could think about and plan an action they could take to show the rest of the school what this kind of love looks like.
- Classes might take turns to share this with the school perhaps through assembly time or by sending their poster to the other classes.

# These love statements are from 1 Corinthians 13 in the Bible.

Love is patient and kind.

Love is not jealous or boastful.

Love is not proud or rude.

Love does not demand its own way.

Love is not irritable.
