# Seeding Reciprocity



Tending pollinator and medicine gardens, and preparing and sharing herbal medicine, is a concrete way to participate in much needed healing of our ecosystems and our bodies.

Modern human practices of extraction from Earth and from our fellow beings have disrupted the balance of our ecosystems. As a global human family, we face a flood of catastrophe in the form of pandemic illnesses, social inequity, and climate disasters.

The sharing of plant knowledge and medicines can help heal the wound of separation between modern humanity and our abundant caring planet. Plants also have much to offer towards the racial, cultural, and class wounds we carry. Gardening can ease the pain of chronic illnesses, and immersion with plants and animals can help us to become more centered in our body, mind, and spirit.

For over 40 years, Avena Botanicals, under Deb Soule's leadership, has offered courses, practices, and herbal remedies to promote an ethic of reciprocity with Earth and her many beings, and address the crises we face at this time.

It is with deep commitment to Deb's vision of interconnected sanctuary gardens and plant medicine that we announce the 2025 launch of the Herbal Hummingbird Hub.

Based in the magical gardens and classrooms at Avena Botanicals in the Wabanaki homelands of mid-coast Maine, we envision expanded educational programs and networks of medicinal gardens for pollinators and people. Our guide is the Ruby-throated hummingbird — we hope to emulate this courageous and interdimensional being in our work of reconnecting people with one another, the medicine plants, and the sacred rhythms of Earth.



# Rooted in Community

The Herbal Hummingbird Hub tapped into community roots to refine its mission and niche.

The rebirth of The Herbal Hummingbird Hub began in 2020, when our gardens closed to the public. During this time, we reflected deeply on our purpose and how we could contribute to the broader work of decolonizing our mindsets, herbal mutual aid, community health care, climate changes, and healing generational trauma.

We paused our programming to envision how we could create space for ancestral healing and trainings for herbalists and gardeners from underserved communities. Between 2020 and 2023, we piloted several programs designed to offer a safe and nurturing environment for BIPOC herbalists and healing artists.

We also see the Hub as a space for those of us descended from settlers to confront and address the legacies of colonialism and white supremacy. Through educational gatherings, we strive to rekindle ancestral knowledge and foster ongoing work of generational change in healing and decolonization. # Nurturing Vision

#### **Mission:**

The Herbal Hummingbird Hub's mission is to serve people, plants, and pollinators by tending to herb gardens, teaching herbal medicine, and stewarding racial and environmental healing.

#### Vision:

We envision a network of sanctuary gardens along the migration route of the Rubythroated hummingbird and beyond. These gardens will be connected by pollinators, by the knowledge of herbal medicine we exchange with one another in our classrooms and gardens, and by the sharing of mutual aid to communities Interdependence in need. ### Blossoming Forward

#### The seed

Avena Botanicals began in 1985 with the leadership of founder and herbalist Deb Soule, who wanted to make handcrafted organic herbal remedies more accessible. In 1995, the small business moved onto a 32-acre farm, where Deb also began to share her knowledge of herbal plants and medicine with the community.

#### The sprout

The Herbal Classroom was founded by Deb in 2006 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit focused on offering classes on herbal healing and Biodynamic® and organic herb gardening. It has hosted education and programming ever since, encouraging students to use their hearts, hands, and minds to engage in learning the healing ways of plants.

#### The blossom

In 2024, the non-profit chose a new name, the Herbal Hummingbird Hub, to represent the central importance of pollinator protection in our work. Our organization has thus far been entirely volunteerled and at this moment is ready to take the next steps of hiring an inaugural staff.
