## Letter from the Artistic Director

Good evening, one and all! To all our dear friends, family, supporters, allies —our beautiful LGBTQIA2s+ community of Rochester—welcome to Divas of Empowerment!

This evening's concert is one that is so near and dear to our hearts, and we hope yours too. It is no secret that in this day and age, the LGBTQIA2s+ community is under attack across this country. I personally live day to day with an utter sense of shock at how eager so many people and politicians can be to strip away basic human rights from those they misunderstand and deem unworthy. When the Supreme Court legalized marriage equality in 2015, it seemed so permanent and so uplifting. And the steps beyond that that we have taken toward equality for gender-non-conforming, non-binary, and trans people, as well as people of color within our community, seemed like slow and steady progress. Never fast enough, but nonetheless moving in the right direction on the whole. But now, so many of the rights we and our elders fought for, for generations of progress, now seem on the verge of slipping away in a matter of weeks, putting our very lives and futures in danger. We now hear a renewed call to stand up for our existence in all ways imaginable. WE WILL NOT BE ERASED.

To this end, our concert program consists of songs by beloved divas with messages of hope and strength from which I hope we can all take inspiration as a community. These songs celebrate our uniqueness, our authenticity, and our inner empowerment. They are meant to lift us up and remind us that we are strong; we are worthy; and nobody and nothing can replace the beautiful light that our community brings into this world. Tonight, we protest through celebration of our priceless worth.

This is the purpose of the RGMC, as outlined in our mission and vision statement for the last 40+ years, as written by our founding director, Nicholas Williams. Now more than ever, these words resonate within us and unify us with a single goal:

"We the members of the Rochester Gay Men's Chorus unite proudly to seek a better world for ourselves, our community, and for our nation by sowing the seeds of harmony through the universal language of music. We sing for ourselves to make glorious music with friends who experience the world as we do and who share our joy in standing together. We sing for our siblings in the LGBTQIA2s+community to embody pride, family and a sense of home. We sing for our friends and supporters who join us to overcome ignorance and prejudice. We sing for

those unknown and unseen, awakening to who they are, in closets of oppression, or in search of community, that they may see our faces and hear our joy and know that the night is not forever, and that there are friends and brothers to light their way and to welcome them home."

And so tonight we sing for our lives and the lives of all seen and unseen within our community.

## RGMC Artistic Staff



Dr. Alex Kuczynski, Artistic Director

Dr. Alex Kuczyński holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music (MA and PhD, piano studies in the studio of Rebecca Penneys) and Vassar College (BA in music and cognitive science). A collaborative pianist since the age of twelve, Alex had an early career accompanying in school choirs, music festivals and the church. Under real-time pressure at a young age, he quickly sharpened a diverse set of musical skills including sight reading, sight singing, playing an open score, improvisation, music theory, and the coordination of timing and interpretation while playing with other musicians. In high school, Alex competed in state-wide choral festivals as accompanist and won awards at district, regional and all-state levels in Pennsylvania. He was then employed as staff accompanist at Vassar and Nazareth Colleges

over the course of college and graduate school.

Currently, Alex serves as pianist, organist and music director at Trinity Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Rochester, artistic director of the Rochester Gay Men's Chorus, staff accompanist for the Geneseo Central School District, and pianist for opera singers, voice studios, and collegiate instrumental soloists. In addition to concert and church accompanying, Alex also serves as pianist and music director for theater groups such as the Off Monroe Players, Rochester Association of Performing Arts, The Lyric Theatre, the Geneseo Community Players and more. Additionally, Alex continues to enjoy performing solo piano music in a range of styles from the 17th - 21st centuries. An expert teacher in both music theory and piano, Alex has served as Visiting Instructor of music theory at Nazareth College and previously as Graduate Instructor at the Eastman School of Music during the length of his graduate studies, where he taught the whole undergraduate music theory and aural musicianship curriculum. Currently, in addition to performing and music directing, Alex teaches about 30 piano students of all ages, providing a solid music education for individual pianists as they reach and exceed their goals and dreams.



#### **Bob Dietch, Principal Pianist**

A local career musician, many will remember Bob behind the piano at Tara, where he entertained regularly for the majority of its 30-year run in downtown Rochester.

He is an alumnus of SUNY Fredonia School of Music, where he was degreed cum laude in their highly selective Sound Recording Technology program, and inducted into Pi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Society.

Over the years, Bob has enjoyed music-directing and performing for a variety of private and community events, schools, and theatre groups including Blackfriars, Geva, RAPA, OFC Creations, Greater Rochester Repertory Company, Downstairs Cabaret, Rochester Children's

Theatre, East Rochester and Fairport High Schools. He was honored by the Theatre Association of New York State with an Excellence in Vocal Direction award for his work on ETC's Falsettos.

Bob is the longtime collaborative pianist for West Irondequoit Central School District's Choral Music program, the Traveling Cabaret and Temple Emanu-El.



#### Catherine J. Hardesty, CT Sign Language Interpreter

Catherine "Cat" J. Hardesty is a Nationally Certified Interpreter for the Deaf who joined RGMC as the Artistic Interpreter in 1999. She is a freelance Community Interpreter, but her favorite venue is music, especially with RGMC. She lives in Greece with her Life Partner, Robert Slater. Her son Christian and his wife Amber live in Columbus, Ohio where they are both practicing attorneys, and are the proud parents of their daughter Elana Paige!

Mount Hope World Singers (MHWS) seeks to build community and foster intercultural understanding through engaging, high quality, respectful performance of music in original languages from around the globe.

The chorus's repertoire is varied and often includes instrumental accompaniment such as piano, cello, percussion, flute, violin, and cello. In addition, the group happily collaborates with other artists including dancers, solo vocalists, and

other choral ensembles. Past performance venues have included public schools, churches, senior living centers, the Rochester Central Library, the Rochester Psychiatric Center, and Monroe Community Hospital. MHWS has also participated in many community events including the William Warfield Scholarship Celebration, AIDS Awareness Day, and the Rochester People's Climate Coalition March for Global Climate Action. The chorus has collaborated with FuturPointe Dance, Nazareth Dance Ensemble, New Bethel CME Church, the Taiwanese Choir, Sladki Doumi Balkan Women's Chorus, BIODANCE, and many individual performers. They are members of the Greater Rochester Choral Consortium and have performed in their prism concerts at Kodak Hall at the Eastman Theatre.

Conductor Brian White is a graduate of the Eastman School of Music with a Bachelor of Music in Music Education and inspires with his musical expertise, enthusiasm, and humor.

Artistic Director Annika Bentley has been a professional musician for over 20 years. She is a singer-songwriter, composer, and artist with an integrated degree in photography and music.

MHWS rehearses for roughly seven months of the year (February through May and September through December). Rehearsals are held at the Community of the Savior (4 East Henrietta Road, Rochester) and remotely via Zoom on Sundays from 2 to 4 pm. No auditions are required.





The chorus is fragrance-free and is working to become accessible and welcoming to individuals who are blind or have low vision and individuals who for other reasons do not read music.

On June 5 and 7, 2025, MHWS will present "The Hundred Windows" at the Rochester Academy of Medicine. In collaboration with visual artist and animator Christine A. Banna and composer and sound designer Logan Barrett, these immersive, multidisciplinary performances will explore the senses and reflect the vastness of the world we inhabit as humans. Stay tuned to their website for ticketing information, coming soon.




