

Letter from the Artistic Director

Good evening, one and all, and welcome to the jungle! On behalf of the Rochester Gay Men's Chorus, thank you for joining us and helping us kick off Pride Week 2025 in Rochester. As always, it is so important that we are out in our community, living our best lives and just being us — and I can't think of a better way to do so than through the joy of music!

The theme of tonight's concert, "It's a Jungle Out There," carries multiple meanings, as reflected in the repertoire we are singing. On one hand, every song is inspired by an animal in one way or another, and in some cases by a larger theme of a jungle. In this way, we get to have all kinds of fun living various animal fantasies — as the child within us always wants to do, no matter how many years continue to pass! On the other hand, we also use the phrase "it's a jungle out there" to refer to how chaotic, dangerous, and wild the world around us can be, despite how far we continue to evolve as a human civilization.

Strung together, the meaning behind these songs forms a narrative of empowerment, resilience, hope, and love as we navigate through our jungle of a world. It seems that no matter how much we evolve and how advanced we become intellectually, technologically, and culturally, our basic animal instincts and traits are always on the verge of emerging and taking over. And in some cases, they do take over and manifest themselves in surprising ways, whether it be in the context of war, the internet and social media, politics, or anything else.

As a community, LGBTQIA+ people everywhere know this perhaps better than anyone, as so many in our society try to push us to the fringes and question our rights and existence on a seemingly never-ending basis. Yet we continue to stand strong and hold each other close, as we see in the last two songs of the concert: we are all a family, and we will continue to stand in the light and be seen as we are, no matter what challenges come our way!

Nothing gives me greater pleasure than welcoming back to our stage our special guests whom we consider to be our extended family, the Rochester Women's Community Chorus and Flower City Pride Band. We are delighted that both groups can return and share their fabulous music and all the love and pride they bring to the stage and the community around us! We are also thrilled to welcome back percussion wizard Ryan Russell (and his beloved pup, and our honorary RGMC fur-member, Spirit), as well as RGMC's very own Matt Bereza on bass, Sam Fortunato on percussion, and Josh Knapp on ukulele, and of course our small ensembles: VersiTone, the Teddy Bears, and the Rochettes.

Finally, I cannot express enough gratitude for you, our fabulous audience and supporters, without whom none of this would be possible!

Let's take a musical safari and see what surprises are in store!

Dr. Alex Kuczynski, Artistic Director

Dr. Alex Kuczyński holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music (MA and PhD, piano studies in the studio of Rebecca Penneys) and Vassar College (BA in music and cognitive science). A collaborative pianist since the age of twelve, Alex had an early career accompanying in school choirs, music festivals and the church. Under real-time pressure at a young age, he quickly sharpened a diverse set of musical skills including sight reading, sight singing, playing an open score, improvisation, music theory, and the coordination of timing and interpretation while playing with other musicians. In high school, Alex competed in state-wide choral festivals as accompanist and won awards at district, regional and all-state levels in Pennsylvania. He was then employed as staff accompanist at Vassar and Nazareth Colleges

over the course of college and graduate school.

Currently, Alex serves as pianist, organist and music director at Trinity Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Rochester, artistic director of the Rochester Gay Men's Chorus, staff accompanist for the Geneseo Central School District, and pianist for opera singers, voice studios, and collegiate instrumental soloists. In addition to concert and church accompanying, Alex also serves as pianist and music director for theater groups such as the Off Monroe Players, Rochester Association of Performing Arts, The Lyric Theatre, the Geneseo Community Players and more. Additionally, Alex continues to enjoy performing solo piano music in a range of styles from the 17th - 21st centuries. An expert teacher in both music theory and piano, Alex has served as Visiting Instructor of music theory at Nazareth College and previously as Graduate Instructor at the Eastman School of Music during the length of his graduate studies, where he taught the whole undergraduate music theory and aural musicianship curriculum. Currently, in addition to performing and music directing, Alex teaches about 30 piano students of all ages, providing a solid music education for individual pianists as they reach and exceed their goals and dreams.



Bob Dietch, Principal Pianist

A local career musician, many will remember Bob behind the piano at Tara, where he entertained regularly for the majority of its 30-year run in downtown Rochester.

He is an alumnus of SUNY Fredonia School of Music, where he was degreed cum laude in their highly selective Sound Recording Technology program, and inducted into Pi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Society.

Over the years, Bob has enjoyed music-directing and performing for a variety of private and community events, schools, and theatre groups including Blackfriars, Geva, RAPA, OFC Creations, Greater Rochester Repertory Company, Downstairs Cabaret, Rochester Children's

Theatre, East Rochester and Fairport High Schools. He was honored by the Theatre Association of New York State with an Excellence in Vocal Direction award for his work on ETC's Falsettos.

Bob is the longtime collaborative pianist for West Irondequoit Central School District's Choral Music program, the Traveling Cabaret and Temple Emanu-El.



Catherine J. Hardesty, Artistic Interpreter

Catherine "Cat" J. Hardesty is a Nationally Certified Interpreter for the Deaf who joined RGMC as the Artistic Interpreter in 1999. She is a freelance Community Interpreter, but her favorite venue is music, especially with RGMC. She lives in Greece with her Life Partner, Robert Slater. Her son Christian and his wife Amber live in Columbus, Ohio where they are both practicing attorneys, and are the proud parents of their daughter Elana Paige!
