THANK YOU FOR GETTING US TO GALA

Twenty-one members of the Rochester Gay Men's Chorus traveled to Denver, Colorado, July 2-6 to give Rochester strong representation at the tenth quadrennial Gay and Lesbian Association of Choruses (GALA Choruses) Festival. In addition to performing at the festival, the group had the opportunity to network with gay and lesbian choruses from around the country - large and small, new and seasoned — swapping stories and best practices to help each other grow. It was a week of community



building and deeply rooted support, much appreciated by all those in attendance.

RGMC singer Tony Jagla was moved by the feeling of "being surrounded by 6,000 people who all had the same goal — to sing and enjoy each other's company, free from anything or anyone who tried to keep us down."

It was a mutual sentiment. At a group dinner on the last night of the festival, RGMC Artistic Director Rob Strauss asked each member to write down three things they liked about the trip. The most common answer on those pieces of paper? Camaraderie.

Others included:

- the variety of choral sounds and music styles
- amazing performances
- exquisite venues
- seeing so many new RGMC members attend and be excited about our performance
- our partnership with transgender folks to deliver a powerful message
- the friendships made
- the humor and campiness that choruses delivered
- the variety of the workshops
- finding ideas to bring back
- feeling inspired to grow myself and our chorus
- how loving and supportive the audiences were
- cheering on other choruses
- realizing our voices and singing DO make a difference



The excitement started on day one, when the group discovered banners displayed throughout downtown Denver welcoming each chorus by name — and, of course, raced to track down the RGMC's!

During their festival performance, the chorus was thrilled to collaborate with Lindsey Deaton, the artistic director of the Trans* Chorus of Los Angeles, who read the names of transgender people whose lives were taken by violence over the last twelve months, while the chorus sang "Names" by Rochester composer Mark Alan DeWaters. Lindsey, a trans woman herself, described the group as "the definition of true allies" to the transgender community for using their voices to give voice to her community.

The RGMC came back with a strong sense of purpose from all the performances they saw, the workshops they attended, and the friends they made from across the country and beyond. This trip reminded our chorus members and their fellow attendees of the shared power of music — to transform, to heal, to reaffirm, to unite.

Thank you to all who donated and supported our fundraisers to help make this trip a reality. We are already looking forward to GALA 2020 in Minneapolis!

POTLIGHT: NEKA ZIMMERMAN



Neka Zimmerman wouldn't say it was a given that he was going to join a chorus. In fact, he might not sound, at first, like the chorus-seeking type: "I'm not one who seeks out music in my life all that often, and I don't get a lot of inherent enjoyment from it," he says. "I always tell people it's because there's just music playing in my

head all the time, so why would I listen to anything else?"

With that said, Neka has long been active in the queer and trans community in Rochester and was familiar with the RGMC. He attended the holiday concert in December 2014 and decided to take a leap and join a little while later, in January 2016. He has enjoyed bringing some "active creation of music" into his life, rather than just keeping songs in his head.

In addition to the music making, he finds the RGMC to be a great social outlet, providing inspiring bonds he hadn't often found before. "I really enjoy getting to know people in the chorus, people who I probably wouldn't have interacted with otherwise. Especially having the opportunity to meet and interact with queer and gay men from older generations," says Neka. "I didn't have the opportunity to meet or interact with anybody queer as a child or have older queer role models. It's super awesome to be able to

interact with other queer men who have experienced a lot more than me."

That camaraderie and sage guidance are of particular benefit to Neka, who has an important story of his own to share — one that hasn't always been met with acceptance: "I am transgender and a trans man. I think it's really important to share that in the context of being in the gay men's chorus. Historically single-gender spaces can sometimes be harrowing for trans people. After visiting with my parents, who, sadly, aren't particularly interested in embracing me as their son, it's always good to come back here and come back to chorus. Being a member of the chorus has deepened my sense of feeling at home in Rochester."

Neka has found other niches in Rochester as well: he performs as an aerial artist, which he's found to be a great athletic outlet for someone never interested in team sports. And he is working on becoming a certified teaching assistant, currently working as a teacher's aide for students with developmental disabilities. He's found the RGMC has helped him feel more at home along this career path, too, with many other male teachers in the group.

For someone who doesn't typically seek out music, it sure seems fortuitous that Neka found his way to the RGMC, to new connections and acceptance of all that he has to offer.
