**CAMERON COUNTY'S SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT  
ORDERS & RECOMMENDATIONS**

Effective today March 20, 2020, Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr. has ordered and recommended requirements for occupancy of premises and travel restrictions/ movement of people. The second supplemental emergency management order is established on behalf of all of Cameron County and in accordance and conjunction with the National Emergency Declaration issued by President Trump and Governor Abbott's Declaration of Disaster of March 13, 2020 and subsequent orders.

"If we don't do everything that we possibly can right now, as soon as we can, this situation is going to continue to get ahead of us, and instead of having to sacrifice for the next two or three weeks, we may be looking at several months of sacrifice like some other countries are facing" stated Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr. "This is the sole reason for trying to "flatten the curve" and I think we have to be honest with ourselves and understand that in the position that we are in, we have to make the tough decisions today and do everything that we can to protect the people now and not delay. I ask that you heed the warnings of government officials, stay inside and behave responsibly."

At this time, Cameron County will proceed with the established orders and recommendations supported by the honorable mayors of each municipality within Cameron County and in consensus with the County Commissioners' Court.

Each supported supplemental emergency management order indicated is out of an abundance of caution for the protection and safety of all during this difficult time.
