TAKE A GIANT LEAP

ince before the dawn of human history, people have looked to the heavens and let their imaginations run free and that's the starting point of our latest production "Take a Giant Leap."

We look to the sky and imagine we see a lion, a bear, a rabbit, a giant butterfly and soon those imagined creatures come to life... singing original songs and encouraging the audience to join along in dance.

As the show progresses, we go from looking into the sky to actually flying in the sky, first in airplanes and then in rocket ships that take us into space. The highlight of the program is a five foot tall astronaut landing on the moon and then encouraging us to take a giant leap... perhaps one day to Mars.

"Take a Giant Leap" was created for and premiered at the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum... working in cooperation with the Department of Education's "Let's Read! Let's Move!" event. Opening day performances included an introduction by Miss America and award winning chef Carla Hall. The program is the perfect mix of original songs, dance and multiple styles of puppetry including the largest marionette in Rainbow Puppet's history.

"Take a Giant Leap" is available in two versions. The 20 minute version is perfect for museums and outdoor events. The 45 minute version includes additional air heroes including the Wright Brothers explaining how they overcame "Power, Lift and Control" in order to bring us powered flight. This is followed by the Tuskegee Airman celebrating their exploits in Italy. This version can be customized to include other aviation heroes.

Follow Me! An adventure with the Tuskegee Airmen

Join the Rainbow Puppets on a journey with the Tuskegee Airmen. Follow the dreams of a young boy as he wants to help others by flying in the sky... eventually his dreams come true as he follows a path set by Harriet Tubman, Bessie Coleman, Booker T. Washington, and Jesse Owens. In the end, he creates a path of his own that leads to success for others. Highlights include flight training under the watchful eye of aviation pioneer Charles Anderson and a trip to Italy where Benjamin O. Davis leads the team to unprecedented success and into the history books.

This program was commissioned by the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum and had its premiere there on February 6, 2014. It is now available to visit your group.

Note that there are two versions of this program available... a shorter 25 minute version suitable for pre-schoolers and older and perfect for presentation in museums. A longer version is available for school programs and for audiences first grade through fifth.
