
## **Jumping Jack / Alternate Version**


 Select all pieces: 1 body, 2 arms, 2 legs, 4 paper fasteners, 2 short pieces of string, 2 long pieces of string, rubber band.




2. Use the fat side of the cardboard spacer between arms/legs pieces.



- 3. With the rounded edges of the arms/legs above the edges of the spacer, the top holes clear, and the colored sides facing each other, wrap the rubber band around it to hold all the pieces together.
- 4. Thread one short piece of string through both top holes and tie a double knot. Cut off the extra string. Do the same thing for each pair of arms and legs for each jumping jack. Remove the rubber band.




5. Decide which side is the front of the jumping jack. The rounded side is the head, the square side is the bottom. Push a paper fastener through a hole on the front of the body for an arm. Place the prong part of the cardboard spacer over the prongs of the paper fastener on the back of the body. Put the second hole of the arm over the prongs of the paper fastener, and bend the prongs down, with the eraser on a pencil. Remove the spacer and do the same thing for each arm and leg.

6. Tie the end of one long string to a string of the arms, and tie one long string to a string on the legs. Pull both strings down, and hold the jumping jack by the head. You can make it dance and jump.



7. Use the plastic circle to make a face. Place the circle on the front of the body, above the arms. Draw the circle with a pencil. With crayons, color in the face, put in eyes, nose, mouth, hair, freckles. You can add clothes details to the rest of the body freehand. Draw in hands, shoes, a fancy shirt, pants, striped stockings.
