A week before Christmas 2017 I was in New York City (NYC) visiting a fantastic museum, the New




York Historical Society (NHS). One of their exhibits (ending April 22, 2018) is *The Vietnam War: 1945-1975*. It is an excellent exhibit providing multisensory education and multicultural perspective. The learning experience was powerful, and as I navigated the labyrinth of the War's history I experienced a vortex of emotions: anger, bewilderment, disappointment, empathy, and sadness. I left the exhibit more informed about the War's influence and impact on Veterans, the families who lost loved ones, the racial divide, civil disorder, and a host of other intertwining social issues. Of course the answer was "absolutely"! The VWCPO was established by Congress (Public Law 110-181, Section 598, January 2008) to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the War and to honor Vietnam



Veterans who served in the military from November 1, 1955 through May 15, 1975. President Obama issued a Presidential Proclamation to continue honoring, recognizing, and thanking Vietnam Veterans and their families through Veterans Day 2025. More than 1.6 million veterans and their families have been publicly thanked and honored at more than 10,000 ceremonies. We will add to this important number of the "honored, recognized, and thanked" at our reunion!

When Vietnam Veterans returned home they were not well thought of, encouraged not to wear their uniforms, and they were not respected. Vietnam Veterans and their families' sacrifices were unacknowledged for years. Vietnam Veterans were often confronted and shouldered blame because they carried out the orders of superiors and civilian leadership. They were the forgotten generation, until now.
