BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

All Unionville Borough Residents **May Be At Increased Risk From Microbial Contamination.**

We routinely monitor the conditions in the distribution system. On around Saturday, June 6, 2026, we experienced a loss of positive water pressure due to a shutting down the water main to check and repair a water leak. A loss of positive water pressure is a signal of the existence of conditions that could allow contamination to enter the distribution system through back-flow by back-pressure or back-siphonage. As a result, there is an increased chance that the water may contain disease-causing organisms.

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a rolling boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using; or use bottled water. You should use boiled or bottled water for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and food preparation until further notice.

Inadequately treated water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites, which can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches.

These symptoms, however, are not caused only by organisms in drinking water, but also by other factors. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.

Guardians of infants and young children and people at increased risk, such as pregnant women, some of the elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems, should seek advice from their health care advisors about drinking this water. What happened? What is being done?

Unionville Borough water officials are working to address water leaks in the Borough in different locations. A large leak was located on the water main along Race St. in the Borough. Also, we are aware of a water leak somewhere on Mechanic or Buttonwood streets water lines to be addressed. We have had to shut off the main water valve that feeds the Borough in order to repair the Race St. leak. Once repaired, we will test the water and issue a Problem Corrected Notice.

We will inform you when all corrective actions have been completed and when you no longer need to boil your water.
