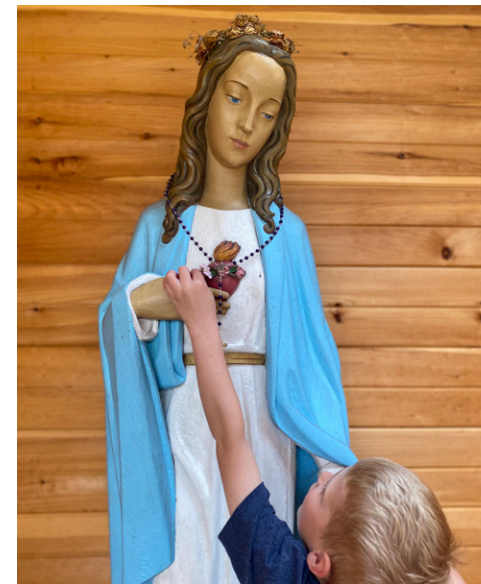


MEET OUR NEW CHAPLAIN

The Catholic Ecology Center provides a magnificent place for people of all ages to encounter our Lord and grow in relationship with Him!

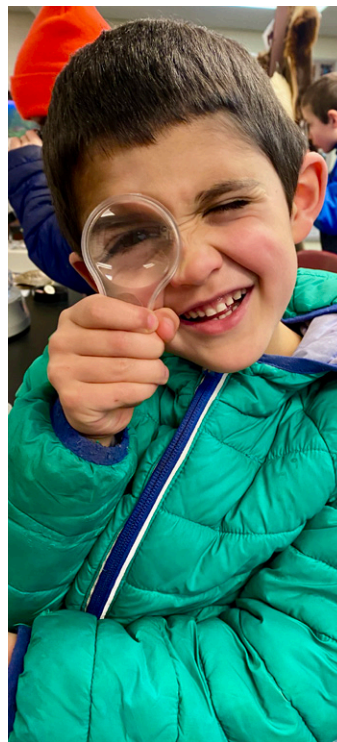
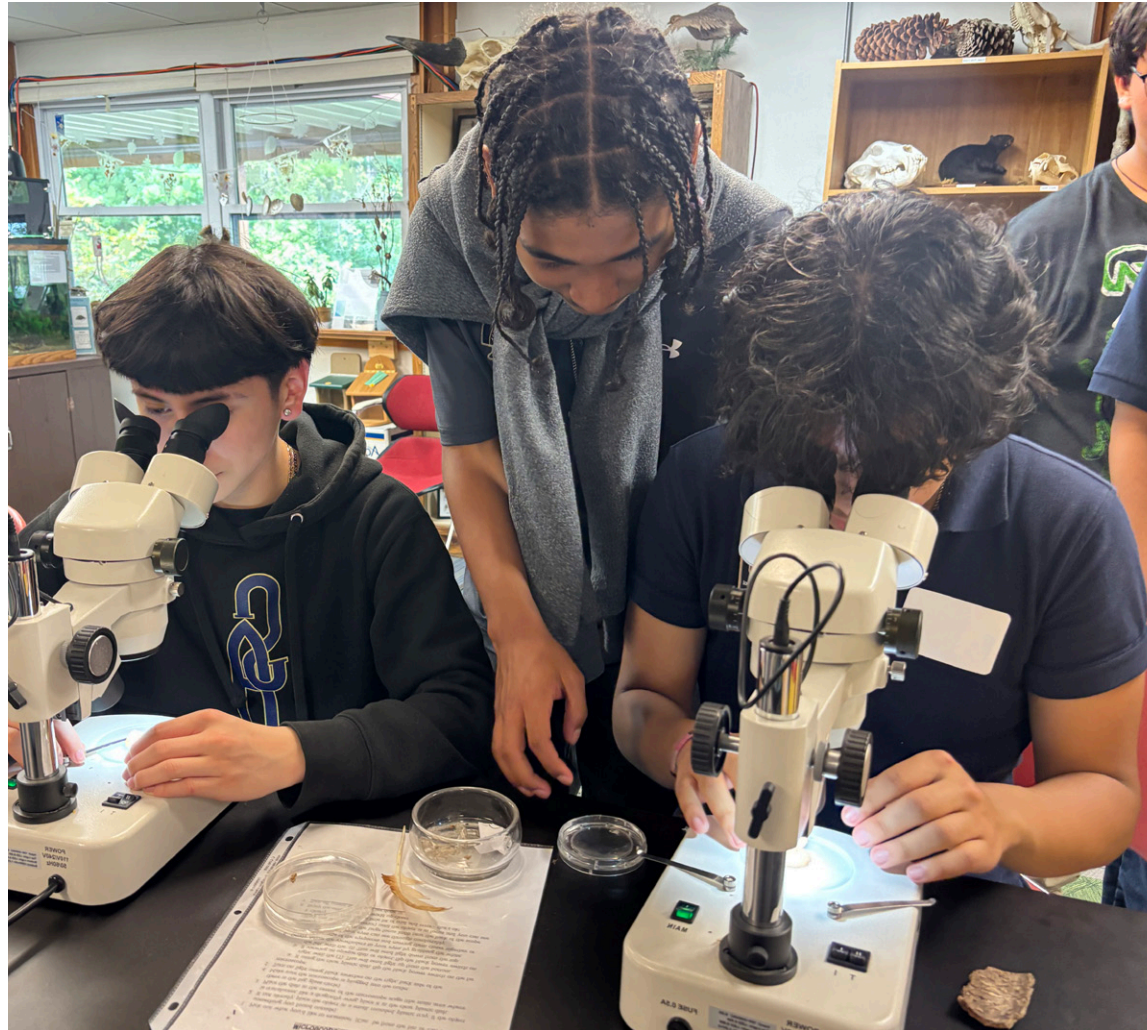
ECOLOGY PROGRAMS



Our ecology programming in 2025 helped foster awe and wonder for the beauty of creation and especially the marvelous Creator behind it all! In our summer camps and through hands-on field sciences, we explore the intricacies and interconnectedness of the ecosystems around us. Through water-quality testing and monitoring wildlife, we seek to know how to be the best stewards possible in caring for the great diversity of species found here: 29 mammal species, 138 bird species and 44 butterfly species! Whether in the forest, pond or prairie the heavens proclaim the greatness of the Lord!

OUR NEW SOLAR ARRAY

The CEC got a new look! Our additional 24kW solar array (now 36kW total) will take us off grid for our electrical needs most of the year. Over the course of our arrays lifespan, it will offset the CO₂ equivalent of planting over 21,000 trees or driving a gas vehicle 1.8 million miles.

CLARE GARDENS



Clare Gardens provides farm fresh produce through a subscription share service to long-term care institutions in the Milwaukee area. These care facilities also come to visit the farm on regular field trips, seeing first-hand where and how their food is grown. Clare Gardens uses regenerative and organic growing methods and aims to provide consistent, nutritious, high-quality produce to kitchens while striving to be good land stewards.

In 2025, Clare Gardens completed its fourth full growing season at the CEC with over 18,000 pounds of vegetable produce made up of 42 crops! The farm works to close the nutrient loop with the resident homes by composting 5,800 pounds of kitchen scraps this year alone. This year, in addition to our honey bees and laying hens, we welcomed to our farmyard Peter and Paul, the Nigerian dwarf goats, and Larry, the kunekune pig.

The fall farmstand makes this amazing organic produce available to all of our visitors and neighbors.

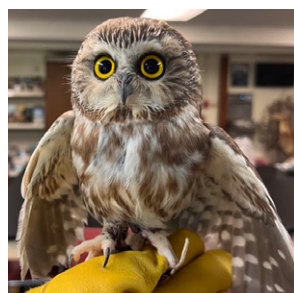
