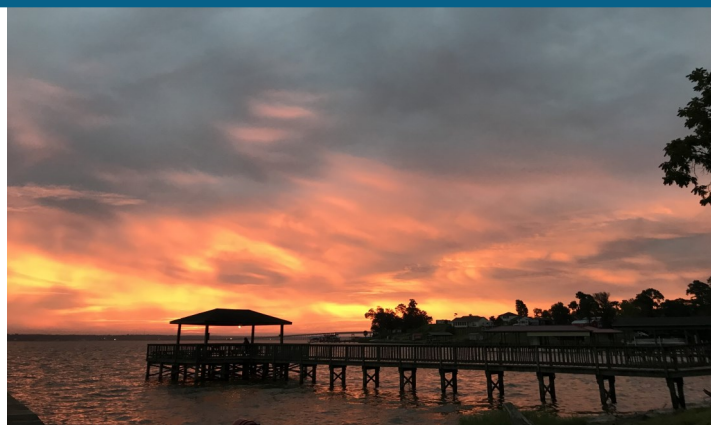

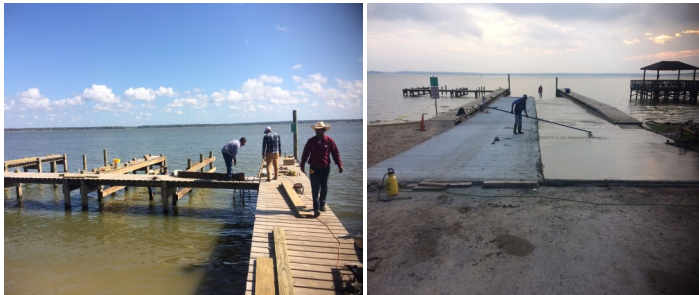

## FALL IS HERE

Fall is here and we welcome the lower humidity and cool air! Cooler temperatures bring the desire to light our fire pits and burn those fallen leaves and limbs, but **PLEASE NOTE:** If we have a burn ban in effect in San Jacinto County there should be no burning of leaves, limbs, or pieces of wood or trash of any kind. **IN TEXAS**, local governments are empowered to take action on the behalf of those they serve. When drought conditions exist, a burn ban can be put in place by a county judge or county commissioners court prohibiting or restricting outdoor burning for public safety. ## RAMPING UP THE RAMP

New concrete overlay was completed on the boat ramp and there will also be new roofing added to the fishing pier as well as cosmetic improvements to that area.
