SUMMER IS HERE

Summer is here and we have had heavy activity at the boat ramp and traffic in the neighborhood. Please remember there are Texas laws that require a certain age limit behind the wheel of a golf cart, ATV, or 4-wheeler. If we receive complaints of aggressive behavior behind the wheel of one of these vehicles, or underage drivers that are not with an adult, we will contact the Sheriff's department. There have been unfortunate accidents in the neighborhood through the years involving children who do not have the experience to drive and are not being supervised.

CRIME WATCH

We continue to address crime. Our new cameras have been installed and have helped resolve issues of damaged gates, unauthorized entry to our village and acts of vandalism. There was an arrest made in previous theft of lowboy trailer and battery thefts are down although still an issue. Please be watchful and secure your items with locks; cameras are encouraged. Also, please report crimes to San Jacinto County Sheriff's Office.

BOAT RAMP PARKING REMINDER

Due to our growing community, we experienced issues with vehicles blocking access to our boat ramp last year. You will see NO PARKING SIGNS posted near the boat ramp. If vehicles, golf carts, ATV's or 4-wheelers park there, they will be towed or hauled off at owner's expense. If you choose to swim in the water near the boat ramp (at your own risk), find



another place to park (not blocking someone's property). Property owners that are launching their boats and choose to park their vehicles and trailers in the allotted parking area are first come first served. Please respect the property owners that have homes on both

sides and across from the boat ramp. You cannot block or park on their property. Only short-term parking is allowed at the boat ramp dock while you park and retrieve your trailer for loading/unloading your boat. No overnight parking is allowed.
