Ms. Hopper's role as the Chief Strategic Initiatives Officer with National Safe Place Network includes development and support for national initiatives and partnerships. Additionally, she has been a member of the National Safe Place Advisory Board for 20 years.

Ms. Hopper has extensive experience working with runaway, homeless, and street youth. She has developed and led runaway and homeless youth (RHY) programs, managed a multi-state national award from the Corporation for National and Community Service, led a multi-state initiative to improve capacity of faith-based organizations, and directed a multi-state award from the Office of Refugee Resettlement to address Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children. She has worked on an inpatient psychiatric unit for youth, served as a member of a Mobile Crisis Unit, and worked as a therapist for a project dedicated to preventing sexual abuse of Appalachian children.

Ms. Hopper has conducted training in 42 states and is recognized as a master facilitator of the group process. She has contributed to curricula on a variety of topics, including human trafficking and youth development. She was on the subject matter expert team that developed the national certification exam for grants professionals.

## Speakers

### Alison Boak

Alison Boak is a co-founder of the National Human Trafficking and Disabilities Working Group. As a pioneer in the field of human trafficking, Ms. Boak has created several model programs and founded numerous organizations, networks, and coalitions to coordinate the multi-disciplinary work required to assist trafficked persons.

Alison Boak was co-founder and Executive Director of the International Organization for Adolescents (IOFA), a non-governmental organization formed to eliminate human trafficking and exploitation of vulnerable adolescents. She is a founding member of the Freedom Network USA for Trafficked and Enslaved Persons, the New York City Task Force against Sexual Exploitation of Youth, the New York City Human Trafficking Task Force, and the Westchester County Anti-Trafficking Task Force.

Ms. Boak received a B.A. English and Political Science from SUNY Albany in 1992. In 1997 she received a Masters of Public Health (MPH) from the Mailman School of Public Health at Columbia

University. She is as a Leader-in-Residence at the Colin Powell School for Civic and Global Leadership at the City College of New York and a Town Board Member in Pound Ridge, NY.

### Jordan Greenbaum

Jordan Greenbaum, M.D. is a child abuse physician in Atlanta, GA. A graduate of Yale School of Medicine, Dr. Greenbaum has worked in the field of child maltreatment for over 20 years.

Dr. Greenbaum is the medical director of the International Centre for Missing and Exploited Children and the medical director of the Institute on Healthcare and Human Trafficking at the Stephanie Blank Center for Safe and Healthy Children at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. She co-chairs the Education/Training committee for HEAL Trafficking, an organization of medical professionals working on human trafficking issues. Dr. Greenbaum provides training on human trafficking and exploitation locally, nationally, and internationally.
